


# 字彙精粹

閱讀是智慧成長不可缺的一環，單字則為閱讀理解重要的另一環。因此若不能了解閱讀的字，必然影響到對文章的理解。字彙的重要性自不待言了。

本書所彙編而成的單字是以美國大學閱讀與考試中出現頻率較高的高級單字為主。這些字並非是任意挑選，而是根據美國教育考試委員會的常用字彙表編著而成的本書的字彙由淺而深，循序漸進。本書計有十二單元，每一單元包括五個章節。此外，還有一個補充單元，內有八個章節。書末的附錄是以G R E 歷屆考試的字彙編纂而成。

本書的特色：每一章節有一固定的名稱。編排上是把相似的字彙以字母的順序排在同一章裏。單字是以K. K. 音標為主，有詞類的註明，例句，以及相似詞和相反詞，所有的例句均附中文翻譯。作者本身了解有些句子是根本無需翻譯。但是為了求編排上的統一、整齊與悅目。中譯前後花了六個多月的時間，希望作者的苦心能對同學有所助益。相似詞與相反詞是經過作者審慎思考決定的。書末附上索引以便查閱。

## 1. AGREEMENT — 致

**accost** [ ə'kɒst ]

v. To approach and speak to first.

走上前去跟(某人)講話。

As soon as he left home, he was accosted by a CIA agent.

syn. speak to, nab, buttonhole, waylay.

ant. evade, avoid, ignore, shun, overlook.

**assent** [ ə'sent ]

v. To express agreement.

同意；贊成。

He assented to their views.

他同意他們的觀點。

syn. agree, concur, consent, give in, go along,  
yield, concede, comply, accede, accept,  
approve, acquiesce.

**ant.** dissent, disagree, disapprove, oppose,  
protest, take exception.

### **attest** [ ə'test ]

v. 1. To affirm to be correct, true, or genuine.

證實；證明。

I can attest that he is an honest man, for I  
have known him for many years.

我可以證明他是個誠實的人，因為我已認識他多年。

2. **attest to.** To bear witness.

證明；證實。

The handwriting expert attested to the  
authenticity of the signature.

筆跡鑑定專家證明簽名是真實無誤的。

support, testify, certify, substantiate.

**ant.** deny, refute, contradict, discredit,  
falsify.

### **concord** [ 'kɔnkrɔd, 'kɔŋ- ]

n. Harmony; accord; concurrence.

和諧；一致；協調。

Concord became discord when the singer sang off-key.

歌手唱走了調，所以諧和音變成不諧和音。

The planets move in harmony and concord.  
衆行星和諧運行。

syn. agreement, unity, concordance,  
compatibility, communion, rapport, peace.  
ant. discord, dissent, disagreement, antipathy,  
odds, hostility.

### **consistent** [ kən'sɪstənt ]

adj. Compatible or in agreement; or keeping the  
same principles or actions.

一致的；一貫的。

His statements were consistent with each other.  
他的聲明前後一致。

His actions were not consistent with his words.  
他的言行不一致。

syn. consonant, homogeneous, congruous,  
harmonious, compatible, congenial,  
agreeing, suitable, sympathetic.

illogical, incompatible, unsuitable.

### **covet** [ 'kʌvɪt ]

v. To desire (that which is another's); crave.  
妄想（別人的東西）；覬覦；渴望。

The old cat coveted the affection given the new  
kitten.

syn. envy, long for, wish, yearn.

### credence [ 'krɪdəns ]

n. 1. Acceptance as true; belief.

信任。

Don't give credence too easily to what you  
see in print.

不要輕易相信所閱讀的印刷品。

2. The quality of being trustworthy.

可靠。

His father was a man of great credence.

他的父親是個很可靠的人。

### fidelity [ fai'deləti, fe- ]

n. 1. Faithfulness; loyalty.

2. Truthfulness; accuracy.

He reported the discussion with fidelity.

**liaison** [ lie'zə ]

n. 1. Communication between groups or units.

聯絡。

There was an excellent liaison between the army and the industry.

2. A close relationship; an illicit relationship.

私通。

His liaison with the married woman cost him his job.

因為他與有夫之婦私通，所以丢了工作。

### **palaver** [ pə'lævə, pə'lavə ]

n. Long and idle chatter or cajolery.

空談；哄騙；引誘。

The two little girls held a palaver to decide how to spend their quarter in the cookie store.  
兩個小女孩在餅乾店裏商量怎樣來花用她們的兩毛半。

syn. discussion, talk, confab, rap session  
(slang).

### **plaudit** [ 'plɔdɪt ]

n. An expression of praise.

稱讚；讚揚；喝采；拍手（常用複數）。

Long after the play, the leading actress could hear the plaudits of the audience still echoing in her ears.

落幕之後，許久許久，女主角仍能聽到觀眾的喝采，繚迴不絕於耳。

syn. applause, congratulations, cheers, hurrahs,  
approval, commendation, approbation, honor,  
compliments.

ant. censure, boos, disapproval, catcalls,  
reprimand, rebuke.

**solidarity** [ ˈsɔlɪdərəti ]

n. Unity of purpose, interest, or sympathy.

團結一致。

It is hard to achieve solidarity when each person thinks only of himself.

要是每個人所想到的只是他自己，那就很難團結一致了。
