# 内容提要

《英语专业四级考试·口语测试》一书分为两大部分,第一部分"英语专业四级口试概述及解题思路与方法",从英语专业教学大纲与考试大纲的角度对大二专业英语四级考试口语测试的要求进行了介绍,分析了其题型特点、评分标准,并提出了相应的应试技巧,以使考生对该项目及测试重点有个宏观上的了解,同时通过对历年真题的详细梳理和解析使考生获取不同题型的解题思路,切实提高应试能力;第二部分"口语聚宝盆",分析了学生在口语中的常见错误,列出了与真题相关的名言谚语。此外还提供了专业英语四级考试口试冲刺必备方法、口语复述速记符号汇编,英语专业四级口语考生可去的网站等,作为附录。

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# 英语专业四级考试・口语测试

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# 前言

全国高等院校英语专业基础阶段考试(TEM 4)是由高等院校外语专业指导委员会主持实施的全国性考试。针对英语专业四级口语测试,考生们不知道如何复习、如何准备考试的问题,为帮助他们解决困难、指点迷津、明确方向、提高学习效率,进而顺利通过专业四级口语测试,我们特编写此书。本书有以下特点:

# 一、题型涵盖历年真题,解析命题规律

本书在总结历年真题的基础上,对英语专业四级口语测试的三大部分进行了全面细致的分析,归纳了口语测试三大部分的类型和特点。第一部分复述以记叙文为主,复述重点应是时间、地点、人物、事件。第二部分即席讲话,只有一年要求考生描述人物,其他年份都要求考生描述自己的经历;第三部分两名考生交谈,将历年真题分为选择类、分析类、途径类和展望类。通过题型解读,全面剖析专业四级口语测试重点和难点,逐一突破,具有很强的针对性。口语应试技巧,给考生提供了行之有效的考试应对方案,教会考生如何从语音语调、词汇语法、逻辑性上全面提高,以及如何将平时所学的英语知识有效地输出。

# 二、提供大量口语素材,让你妙语连珠

本书的"真题拓展"内容是严格按照《大纲》要求,经过认真推敲和反复讨论,层层筛选而最终挑选出来的。试题的设置、出题方向、考点分布,都力求最大限度地接近真题,重现真题风貌。重点解决考生无话可说的问题,教考生从十大万能角度打开思路,做到触类旁通,以不变应万变,让考生思路滔滔不绝。其中"二十一类句型百宝箱",教考生有效地遣词造句;"名言谚语聚宝盆"让考生的表达锦上添花。

## 三、精彩范文外教原创,表达地道丰富

本书针对历年真题,从真题再现、审题思路、实战演练、钻石句型、真题拓展五个方面突破。其中在"审题思路"板块,分析题目类型,给出口语表达思路,理清表达的脉络和逻辑。在"实战演练"板块,提供外教原创范文,逻辑严密,层层递进,表达地道丰富。在"钻石句型"板块,从遣词造句的角度指出外教范文的闪光点,考生可以灵活地运用在自己的作文中,实现学以致用。

本书一方面指导考生了解并掌握基本的口语技能,学会如何构思,并能恰如其分地表达主旨;另一方面,指导考生熟悉近年来的口语热点话题,做到有的放矢地应考。

本书不仅适合作为英语专业四级口语测试的备考指南,也可作为雅思口语、BEC 口语备考指南,同时可供英语中级以上的学生和英语爱好者使用。

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# 英语专业四级口试概述及解题思路与方法

# 第一章 概 述

# 第一节 英语专业四级口试简介

1.《英语教学大纲》对专业四级口试的要求

发音正确;较好地掌握朗读和说话的节奏感;掌握语流中的语音变化规律、连读、辅音爆破和语音同化等技巧以及陈述句、疑问句和祈使句的语调;初步掌握语段中语音轻重和新旧信息传递之间的关系;能在一般社交场合与英语国家人士交谈,做到正确表达思想,语音、语调自然,无重大语法错误,语言基本得体。

2. 口试时间与对象

本考试每年一次,于当年5月份进行。考试对象为高校英语专业二年级本科生。

3. 口试形式

本考试采取录音形式,考生在语言实验室内根据录音考题的要求回答问题,并将答题的内容录制下来。考试结束后,各考点将考生的磁带封存,并在规定的时间内寄到指定评分点。

4. 口试内容

根据《英语专业四级口试大纲》的要求,口试内容将分为三项:

- (1)复述故事(听两遍故事后复述3分钟);
- (2)即席讲话(根据所给的题目准备3分钟后,作即席讲话3分钟);
- (3)对话(根据规定的角色各自准备3分钟后,对话4分钟)。

口试第一部分所要复述的故事大约有 300 字,一般都是描述过去发生的事情。听故事时,允许考生记笔记。听完两遍后考生直接复述,没有准备的时间。口试第二部分即席讲话的题目一般都与复述故事的主题有一定的联系,即席讲话需要描述考生自己的经历。口试第三部分的对话内容一般都是大学生所熟悉的话题。双方对话采用讨论的方式,考生针对某个话题各抒己见。

# 第二节 英语专业四级口试评分标准

评分项目为五项:复述、即席讲话、对话、语音语调及语法。其中,前三项评分主要是针



对三项任务的完成情况,后两项评分则是对考生在完成前三项任务中的语音语调及语法的总体评价。

具体评分过程如下:

- (1)评分教师首先给三项任务依次打分,但每项任务的评分重点不同。复述部分强调故事的完整性与条理性;即席讲话强调内容切题、丰富、条理清楚,表达流畅;对话部分强调讨论充分、遵循交际原则。
- (2)评分教师就考生在三项任务中的语音语调与语法进行总体的评价,打综合分。分数采用百分制,每五分为一档。
- (3)将五项分数相加,得到总分。
- (4)每盘磁带由两名教师评分,两个分数的平均数为每位考生的原始成绩。
- (5)将原始成绩转换成优秀、良好、及格与不及格四个等级。凡是成绩在及格以上的学生可获得全国高校外语专业教学指导委员会颁发的证书。

# 第四节 如何突破英语专业四级口试

评分教师首先给三项任务依次打分,但每项任务的评分重点不同。复述部分强调故事的完整性与条理性;即席讲话强调内容切题、丰富、条理清楚,表达流畅;交谈部分强调讨论充分、遵循交际原则。然后,评分教师就考生在三项任务中的语音语调与语法进行总体的评价,打综合分。



第一项是复述。复述的文章多为记叙文,评分时强调故事的完整性与条理性。所以要求考生首先在听时就对文章的时间、地点、人物、事件等重要信息做好相关的笔记;抓住主要线索后,考生用自己的话把原文复述出来。考生在平时练习时,要循序渐进,可从对一两句话的复述开始,听完后用自己的话(英语)把所听到的内容说出来,一遍复述不下来,可多听几遍,练习的次数越多,重听的次数就越少。另外,在保证语言正确的前提下,考生应适当改变句子结构,使表达形式更为丰富。练习时所选的材料要有明确的情节,生词量不要太大。可选《新概念英语 2》《新概念英语 3》中那些知识性强的小短文。复述实际上对英语综合能力的培养很有帮助。考生如果时间较充足,可以在口头复述的基础上,再用笔头复述一遍,这样做可以加深语言掌握的精确程度,提高书面表达能力。

第二项是即席讲话。除了1998年(描述你的邻居)和2001年(描述一位不同寻常的老师)的考题是描述人以外,其他都是对事件的描述,评分时强调内容切题、丰富、条理清楚,表达流畅。考生可以采取自练自说的方法,就是自己把准备过的材料或答案反复练习直至能流畅地讲述出来。在使用此方法时,考生可考虑对着镜子练习,并加上适当的肢体语言。此方法尤其适合口语基础较薄弱、缺乏自信的同学。考生通过这样的练习,可以培养语感、增加语言的流利性,从而树立自信。

第三项是对话。评分时强调讨论充分、遵循交际原则。纵观十几年来的真题,可以把所有真题分为4类——选择类、分析类、途径类、展望类,主题都是围绕学生的学习和生活相关的或具有争议性的话题展开讨论。考生找到自己的考试搭档(考试搭档可以自己定,一般是和自己水平相当、经常在一起的同学),约定话题后集中练习。考生在实战练习前,最好先规定话题,然后对要讨论的话题进行大量准备后,再进行练习。不做准备就直接开练的做法并不可取,因为效率太低,效果太差,考生容易产生挫败感。

第四项是语音语调。发音基础较好的考生主要锻炼流利度;本身发音基础就不是太好的考生,应努力掌握基本单词的基本发音。发音方面应致力于从以下几点突破:①口音——经常有考生混淆/h/与/f/,/l/与/n/;②重音——混淆了重音、次重音、轻音;③咬舌音——不能清晰给出 think, three, thank 等咬舌音;④双元音饱满——像/ai/和/ei/这样的双元音,如果考生想发音饱满,必须保持比较大的张嘴幅度,但由于汉语普遍不需要张大嘴发音,因此考生不习惯将这些双元音发得饱满;⑤连读;⑥语气——缺乏最基本的抑扬顿挫,没有适度的起伏、停顿、强调和重读;⑦流利与连贯——避免 uh, ah, er 等词,训练把握说话的语速即可,尽量克服语病。

第五项是语法和词汇。考生在语法方面的问题主要是用错时态或语态、对词性的把握不准确,出现诸如 very admire sb, very love sb, I success 之类的错误。这类错误说明考生对单词的把握只停留在认知的层面,只记了意思而没有记用法。所以考生应把单词放在句子中记,将被动词汇转化为主动词汇,通过词法和句法两方面的提高来提升自己的语法水平。通过多使用朗文英英辞典,掌握其两千词的定义词表,并加以融会贯通,考生一定能实现词汇的多样性。

# 第二章 复 述

# (1995-2010年复述真题)

根据 5W1H 的采分原则: who, when, where, what, why, how 来判断考生是否抓住文章的主要信息点,从而判定其能否抓住文章的主要线索。以下是 1995—2010 年专四口试第一部分的解题思路和得分点。

## 1995 年 The first set
