- 一、本書遵照教育部最新修訂之五年制工業專科學校課程標準編 輯。
- 二、本書共分八册,每學期一册,供五年制工業專科學校第一至 第四學年教學之用。
- 三、本書前六册,每册十課,後二册,每册八課,每課**分**為下述 七部份:
  - 課文:內容分人生哲學、文化修養、現代生活、發明家 傳、文學故事、工業科技等項,取材均為現代作品,但 為適應五專程度,酐予删改,並請英美專家學者潤飾。
  - 2. 字彙:每課平均約三十五字,加詞類變化之衍生字,全 書八册共約三千二百字。附有 K. K. 制注音,並註中 文釋義。
  - 3. 習語:解釋肯要,並附例句,務求正確應用。
  - 詞類:慎選重要字彙,詳列衍生字形,並附用法例句, 期能運用自如。
  - 5. 練習:將課中所學,融入字彙,填充、詞類、翻譯等項 練習中,經口講筆寫,必能得心應手。
  - 6. 對話:引伸課文內容,淺易應對,語法生動自然,卽學 即用。

- 7. 句型:精編各類句型,化繁爲簡,深入淺出,經口講筆 寫,必可熟能生巧。
- 四、本書每册書後附有該書字彙表,俾便查檢。
- 五、為符新訂課程標準,倉促成書,掛一漏萬,在所難免,祈請同 道先進賜示卓見,以求五專教材,止於至善,庶可教者得意, 學者受益。
