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# 前 言

目前,国内供高中生使用的英语泛读教材很少,且大都不能切合学生的实际需要。有鉴于此,我们组织有丰富教学和辅导经验的老师们研究编写了这套《高中英语泛读指导》。

《高中英语泛读指导》与人教版英语新教材相配合,但又有自己独特的编写指导思想,它既不偏离高中英语教学,又为高中生的英语学习指引一条新路。

《高中英语泛读指导》共分三册(五本),按单元编写,每单元在内容上又分为三部分:①速度阅读。旨在培养学生快速并正确地获得书面信息的能力。②扩大词汇量。培养学生猜测词义及从上下文中理解词义的能力,帮助学生扩大词汇量。③趣味阅读。提供原汁原味的英语文章,精选欧美名家名作,并融入一些风土人情及相关知识,以激发学生的学习兴趣。同时指导学生在对篇章结构等方面整体认识与理解的基础上进行训练。

本套书与人教版英语新教材相对应:第一册(上)供高一年级第一学期使用,第一册(下)供高一年级第二学期使用,第二册(上)供高二年级第一学期使用,第二册(下)供高二年级第二学期使用,第三册供高三年级使用。《高中英语泛读指导》是根据高中各年级学生的学习情况和实际水平编写的,经郑州市第一中学试用效果良好。同学们如果能按要求坚持学用此书,英语水平一定会逐步地明显提高;即使毕业后继续深造,也还会感觉到本书"指导"的深刻影响和积极作用。

# 注意扩大阅读量

#### ---《高中英语泛读指导》代序

英语阅读分为精读(intensive reading)和泛读(extensive reading)。

高中生学习英语课文是以掌握知识和技能为目的。在教师的 指导下,对课文进行语义、语法甚至篇章结构的分析,对部分或全 部课文进行背诵,伴之以写作训练,这样的阅读可称之为精读。

要学好英语只靠精读课文是不够的。有专家指出,我国高中学生至少还要有 20 万字的阅读量,这是现行教材阅读量的三倍多。这种阅读以扩大词汇量、提高阅读速度和掌握文章要义为主要任务,我们可称之为泛读。

据了解,有很大一部分同学忽视英语课外阅读,他们虽然对教 科书下劲不少,但仍显得学不敷用,缺乏实际运用英语的能力。他 们亟需扩大英语的阅读量。

这样做是十分必要的。首先,大量阅读可以巩固课本上学到的词汇,扩大词汇量。学习单词不能脱离文章就词记词。因为脱离文章,就词记词,一是不易记忆;二是记住了也往往是其静止的意义,基本上没用。绝大多数单词只有在特定的语言环境中才有确定的意义。扩大阅读量,与文章中大量的在多种多样情况下复现的单词不断"见面",也就能记得牢、记得活。

其次,大量阅读能真正掌握英语语法知识。课本中的语法知识,是从运用中归结出来的。对于英语非母语的我们,这些条条通常只有通过大量阅读英语材料才能加深理解,才能学会灵活运用。

不少同学对规则记得很熟,但做起题来老是出错,原因就在于他的规则是背出来的,而不是在"用"中学会的。

通过大量阅读,慢慢地你就会产生一种感觉,这种感觉引导你 正确运用和理解语言,这就是"语感"。学习任何一种语言,培养语 感是非常重要的。没有一定的阅读量,就不会有什么语感。

大量阅读还可以了解英语国家的社会文化背景。不了解使用 这种语言的人们的思维方式及价值观念,不了解他们的历史、风俗 习惯及待人接物的方式等,就不能真正读"通"他们的语言。

大量地阅读,首先可在老师的指导下选择难易适中的读物。 正像 John Churchman 在 On Reading 一文指出的那样: "Don't start reading a book unless you see, from the first few pages, that it's one you can read with ease and understanding."只有这样,你才会越读越有兴趣,不致中途放弃。

另外,当你拿到一本书或一篇材料时,要一口气把一个篇章读完。John Churchman 告诉我们: "Don't stop every time you come to a word or phrase you don't know … Quite often you'll find the unknown word comes again, perhaps several times, and by end of the chapter you will have guessed its meaning."

有的同学有种错误的想法:"我课文还没学会,哪有精力去读课外的东西。"他不明白"凡事只有多接触才能熟悉之"的道理,更何况加读的是那些经行家精心选择科学安排的呢。读一篇合适的课外文章就好像在两篇课文中加个小台阶,使学习提高的"坡度"减缓,这样你就容易学好学通教科书了。

# 学法指导

#### 一、关于速度阅读

1.什么是速度阅读

速度阅读即快速地阅读。初学者阅读的速度一般相当慢。如果想尽快提高速度,就应当接受针对性的系统训练。

速度阅读部分不教词汇和语法,目的只在于培养读者通过阅读迅速获取信息的能力。

- 2. 如何进行速度阅读的训练
- ①在阅读开始及结束时要认真填写文章前的表格,计算时间 要精确到秒。
- ②每进行一次阅读训练,都要有意识地在不影响正确理解文章内容的前提下尽力缩短时间。
  - ③阅读时不纠缠语言细节,不查字典,不探究语法问题。
- ④在阅读过程中,身体不要晃动,要克服头部随字行的阅读来回转动的习惯,克服用手或笔指读的习惯,要做到口不出声(嘴唇也不翕动),不回读,注意力高度集中。
- ⑤做文章后的练习时,要凭借阅读时的记忆思考答案,不再查阅文章。
- ⑥每学期结束,要依据记录划出坐标线来检查阅读速度及理解水平的提高幅度。

#### 二、如何处理后两部分中的生词

阅读中常会有生词挡道,一遇到生词就查字典或问老师,要耗掉不少时间和精力,会影响阅读速度,还会减弱阅读的兴趣。有些

生词的出现不影响对文章的整体理解,像人名、地名此类专有名词或物品名称等,尽可跳过不管,而有些生词的意义从上下文中就可判断出来。如果有的生词阻碍了阅读,并且十分关键,可以查查字典,但只需弄清楚在文中的意思即可,不必费时费力硬记,因为随后的阅读中它们往往会反复出现,查阅二三次后就可掌握了。

#### 三、如何使用此书

英语阅读应坚持每天进行。"速度阅读"是要一气呵成的,因 其内容相对简单些。可安排在单元教学开始时进行,但要始终注 意阅读速度是否放慢,答题正确率是否降低等。"扩大词汇量"部 分的各篇文章,可根据其难易程度确定自己是一次还是两次完成 阅读,时间拖得过长,阅读时间太分散,会影响自己对文章的整体 理解。可以在教师的指导下完成,也可自己借助字典来进行。该 部分所附的练习如能做正确,就表明你已很好地理解了与练习相 对应的各篇内容了。"趣味阅读"部分读懂、读明白就算可以了,所 附练习做得对错是检查你是否读懂的依据。此部分的注释是帮你 理解阅读内容的,没必要下大力去记忆相关的生词。若有些生词 你感到面熟,不妨先猜一下词义,然后再看注释,这也是记单词的 一个好方法。

读者朋友们可以根据自己的实际情况安排一个星期内每天的 阅读任务,但每个单元的阅读任务必须在下单元的学习开始前完 成,以免造成任务的积压。
