

前 言

我国经济的发展和国际交流的扩大对当代大学生的英语口语能力提出了更高的要求。在教育部最新颁布的《大学英语课程教学要求(试行)》中也明确指出,大学英语的教学目标是培养学生英语综合应用能力,特别是听说能力,使他们在今后工作和社会交往中能用英语有效地进行口头和书面的信息交流。针对这一形势及要求,结合我国大学英语教学的实际,我们编写了这套英语口语教材。

本套教材结构连贯,具有情节性。全书以大学生 Mike Li 的学习生活为线索,从入学报到开始,直到大学毕业,引出一系列的话题。这种具有情节性的写作 思路可以增加内容的趣味性。书中的人物身份与本书的学习者一样,都是中国的大学生,学习者易于产生亲切感,激发开口说英语的兴趣。学习本书,可以对当代的大学学习过程有更深的了解与把握。

全书取材贴近中国大学校园,贴近大学生的生活,贴近中国文化,是一套真正属于中国大学生自己的英语口语教材。练习针对性强,任务明确,易于在教师指导下进行口语操练,从而帮助学习者消除口语训练中的焦虑。各单元除编写一些与大学生活紧密相关的对话和练习之外,还特别设立 Useful Words and Expressions 栏目,介绍与中国大学生活息息相关的事物的英语表达法。

本套教材注重文化素质的培养,各单元均设计 Window to China 栏目,专门介绍中国的文化、风俗、山水、人物等。通过学习本套教材,学习者将学会使用英语来介绍熟悉的中国文化,描述身边生动而有趣的事物。现在,很多英语学习者可以用英语介绍国外的事情,但在谈到中国的事物和现象时,却不知道如何表达。系统学习完本套教材后,学习者将惊喜地发现,这种尴尬不复存在,与英语为本族语言的人们进行交流将变得轻松而有趣。

本套教材的编写融科学性与创新性于一体。教材运用多种策略及方法,对不同层次的英语学习者进行系统训练,同时也介绍了重要的功能意念句型。在细节的处理上,每个对话后面的练习既是巩固对话的内容,又是对功能意念句型的介绍与训练,二者有机地结合在一起。

本套教材是中外教师合作的成果。在中国工作的美国教师 William Haslag、 Jared Lee-Guyer 及加拿大教师 Reg Cartmale 全程参加了本教材的编审工作。编 写人员还经常与外教进行交流,以确保教材语言准确、规范,是富有时代性的 新鲜的口语表达方式。

本套教材体系完整,分为初级(上册、下册)、中级(上册、下册)和高级,共有五册。本书是初级下册,由十个单元组成。每个单元由三部分组成,即 In-class Activities,After-class Activities 和 Window to China。本册书的 In-class Activities 部分由三个对话组成,对话内容都与大学校园生活有关。每个对话后都精心编排了相应的口语练习,形式多样、生动活泼,配有图片,学生不用提前准备就可以在课堂上进行。另外,在这部分的后面,设有 Useful Words and Expressions 栏目,补充口语练习中可能用到的相关词汇,为学生自由表达提供了极大方便。After-class Activities部分需要学生在课外准备之后,在课堂上进行演示,目的是培养学生用英语描述事物、陈述观点的能力。Window to China 部分以介绍中国的民俗文化为主,主题包括京剧、书法等。

总之,这是一套贴近中国大学生的口语教材,希望能为广大师生所接受和垂 爱。同时,我们也恳切希望广大师生在使用过程中对教材的不足之处提出批评 指正,以使该套教材能不断地改进和完善。


