LE Roy de Perse avec 15. millé chevaux & 50. millé hom-
mes de pied assiege Dille à deux journées de la ville de Ba-
bylone: où le grand Seigneur a fait faire commandement
à toutes les laundaines de le rendre sous peine de la vie / &
continuer nonobstant ce diversement là à faire tout hōt vne alpro-
priete aux prencrs de Tabac, qu'il fait suffoquer à la fusée.

S. M. Sainte-Céleste a finalement reçu les articles & conductions accordées concernant la paix si long temps attendue en Italie. Il est arrivé à Venise dans Madrillev un accident de feu qui a fort endommagé l'hostel du Comte Olivarez, & le Palais Royal. S. M. a été catholique pour sauver le Marquis d'Ayon de la charge de Général de la marine en la côte de Flandres, & a envoyé Don Ferdinand Contieras pour halter le département de la flotte de Vesteinde. Le Clergé contribue en Portugal deux cens-vingt-cinq mil escus pour subvenir à la nécessité présente des affaires.

La ville d'Ulm a refusé ouvertement la contribution que le Commissaire Imperial lui demandoit, & respondit au Magistrat qu'il acceptoyent la resolution de l'assemblée de Lipscic. On faisait mal à cez contres les Regimes d'Italie & Mais on croit que le passage leur sera refusé par le Régime de France qui ont desja leur force Soldats.

Les empereur & le tout le royaume sont alarmez par la prise de Francfort sur l'Oder, & attendent mille Hongrois que le Palatin leur doit envoier, & qui se boudront à la garnison de Landsherg, & autres troupes dont le Meys. Mais illes sont grossis, capables de résister de force aux Suedois entierz
mais pas le sie.

Les Espagnols ne sont point contents, & ne trouvent pour faire de force
dans l'Etat de Milan que les paysages de Savoie soient gardés par les Italiens
dit-on que les Grandes provinces d'entre le Rhône & le Po
ont déclenché la guerre. A quoi les François répondent,
que ce n'est pas à eux qu'ils rendront point ce qu'ils tiennent sans y être
obligés, et que l'exécution du traité de la part des autres.

On a revé des gens de guerre par toute l'Autriche, Sylesie, Moravie, **Deykam**,
Bohème, et la partie de la paix en conséquence, qui donneront bien de l'affaire. **May.**
Le Roi d'Autriche, Le Burgrave de Dona est retourné en Sylesie y
enfourné de son armée. On ne doute plus de la paix d'Italie
et de la paix de Transylvanie. On a tenu public un Edict portant que
l'empereur est à l'abord de l'Allemagne dans le premier de May prochain.
Le Prince Charles le jeune Duc de Frisland, s'en va en qualité de
Gouverneur conduire les troupes qui retourneront d'Italie auquel
le Roy de France a donné 24 mille hommes aux deux Ducs de Frisland.

GENERAL Delfino has put a new Re-enforcement of Troops into Defenzano, so that there are now in that Place 10 Companies of Regular Troops besides Militia. We have Advice from the Poësines that the Ferrabutti, or Imperial Banditti, having plunder'd a Bark that was going up the Po, the Podesta of Rovigo caused them to be pursued; and their Leader with some others were kill'd, 30 taken Prisoners, and the greatest part of the Booty was recover'd: But the Captain who commanded the Soldiers of the Republick was also kill'd. Some Vessels that are arriv'd from Constantinople report that the Turkish Fleet is return'd from the Black Sea, after having furnish'd with all things necessary for their Defence, the 2 New Forts built in the Straights of Caffa overagainst the Muscovite Forts, for the Security of the Crimea. The 2d Infantrist Captain Nicolo Delfino was choiz'd by the great Council to be Procurator of St. Mark, in the room of Signor Piero Venier deceas'd some Days before. On this Occasion there was for 3 Days together Feasting, Drills, Masquerades, and Illuminations at Signor Delfino's Palace, as is the Custom here. The new Procurator is Procurator of Signor Delfino, General of our Troops at the Terra Firma, and also of our Ambassador at the Court of Vienna.

From the Leyden and Leiden Gazettes, dated November 26 and 29.

Venice, November 6 and 7. The 21st of last Month an Express arriv'd here from Brussels, with Letters from the Elector of Bavaria for the Elector, as also Bills of Exchange for 2000 Ducats, and a Preface of fine Flanders-Lace and Linnen. Letters from L'Espresso and Crema dated the 21st of last Month, advise that 4000 German Horse had taken one of 9 Villages of the Bergamasca, all the Corn, Wine and other Provisions they could lay their Hands on; and that 2000 French Horse, starting by Night into the Towns of Orléans and Ombiano, both lying within a Mile of Crema, plunder'd them and treated the Inhabitants with great Injustice. A Letter from Mantua inform us the lez. suis de 2. in Governor of that Place, has stade the necessary Dispositions for receiving the General Officers and Troops of the 2 Crowns

that are to have their Winter Quarters there: The Duke of Mantua was expect'd there in order to his going from thence to Milan, and thence to the Borbonian Islands for the recovery of his Health.

From the Harlem Courant, dated Nov. 29. Cologne, November 23. This 21st at Noon the Prince of Saxe Zeitz arriv'd here from Bonn in one of the Elector Palatin's Yachts, to receive, in the Name of the Emperor, His image of this City, and made his Entry in the following manner: 1st. Came a Company of Grenadiers; then 20 Coaches drawn by a Horse each; next a Troop of Horse well mounted and clad, preceded by a good number of led Horses, Trumpeters, and Kettledrums; after them came 8 Coaches drawn by 6 Horses each, in which were the Syndicks and ancient Burgomasters; then came a Coach in which sat His Highness the Prince, and with him the 2 Ruling Burgomasters, before and after this Coach rode the Horseguards; next came 24 Coaches in which were several Ministers, Persons of Quality, and others; and last of all came our City Troop of Horse very well mounted and accoutred. When his Highness was come to the Town-housa our Cannon were fir'd, &c. they were also twice more during a magnificent Entertainment which lasted till 9 at Night. To Day at Noon his Highness received Homage of our Magistrates and of half the Burghers: To Morrow the other half of the Burghers will do Homage, and take an Oath of Allegiance, with like Solemny.

Flymst, November 27. This Day arriv'd from Port 4 Ships from Rotterdam, and 3 from Zierikzees in Ballast, bound for Bordeaux; and the Marcella of Dublin with Wine from Oporto; Thomas Lee Master, bound for Cork.

Hijmst, November 28. Yesterday was sent in here by the Newborough Galley, Peter Teppery Counterder, a small French Vessel laden with 8000; she was taken out of a Fleet of about 20 Sail under 3 Convoy's, with whom 7 Guernsey Privateers fell in, in the Night: Another of 400 Tons with 20000000 by this Privateer, and one of 1000 Tons with 1000000 by another; but how many more by the rest, it being Night, she cannot give an Account.

Flymst, November 28. There comin' to port 2 Roads her Majesty's Ship Adventure and Niglungen, with some Ships and Vessels bound for Holland; and a Galley laden with


