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2012 年同等学力人员申请硕士学位 英语水平全国统一考试 词汇精记速记

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一前 言一

同等学力英语水平考试在全国所有非英语专业统考英语试卷中,对词汇量的要求最大,达到 6 220 词。下面是与各类国考词汇量的比较。

各类英语考试词汇量比较

同等学力英语考试词汇特点:

- 1. <u>词汇内容范围</u>。有关国家、地区及其首都和主要城市名称、世界各大洲名称、主要山脉河流名称等不包括在 6 220 词条内,而是以附录的形式给出。一些常见的派生词也不列在词条内。这些不同意味着:一是实际要求掌握的词汇量显然大于 6 220;二是要求考生必须掌握常见的词缀,否则无法辨认不包括在词条内的派生词。
- 2. 词义范围。所有的词没有标出要掌握的词义、词性,这意味着每个词的任何一个词性和词义都有可能出现在考卷中,可见词汇测试范围之广。此外大纲附录还要求考生掌握 130 多个前后缀。

词汇是在各类英语考试中取得理想成绩的关键。为了帮助考生复习备考,我们根据最新版考试大纲规定的词汇,对《同等学力人员申请硕士学位英语水平全国统一考试词汇精记速记》一书做了较大的修订。针对同等学力考生社会阅历丰富、知识面宽、理解能力强、善于思考等特点,结合多年英语教学和辅导考试的实践经验,我们打破传统的完全按照字母顺序大排队的方式,将大纲词汇按难度和重点划分为四大部分,每部分内的选词按字母顺序排列,便于考生了解常考词、难点词、易混词,分轻重缓急投放复习时间和精力。具体标准与编写思路如下。

- 1. 第一部分是重点难点词。我们以 1995~2011 年所有词汇题的选项为主,辅以阅读中的难点词,整理、筛选出 1 200 个左右重点难点词,并对这些词进行详细讲解,例句说明用法,近义反义联想链接,目的是使考生熟练掌握这部分词,不但认知,而且会用。
- 2. 第二部分为一般性认知词汇。这部分词出现频率较低,出现在词汇单选题目中的几率很小,对于它们,考生只要认识、知道意思、能根据上下文推测猜出,模糊理解即可。所以这部分讲解中我们舍去了例句,用短语取而代之,通过同义词、反义词、派生词来增加词汇的重现率,以达到举一反三、串联记忆的效果。
- 3. 第三部分是基础词汇,也是本书今年修订改动最大的部分。我们挑选出近 2 000 个初高中时就学过的最最基本的词汇,将他们单列出来,只给词性、词义。对于这部分词汇,考生一般只需要过一遍就能完全回忆起来,这样可以大大节省复习时间。
 - 4. 第四部分是大纲规定的 600 个词组, 我们给这些词组加了例句, 便于考生理解并使用。

5. 最后是附录。除了大纲附录中列出的内容外,我们还增加了常用词根的讲解,帮助考生快速记词,扩大词汇量。

总之,本书在涵盖新大纲全部词汇的基础上,<u>有点有面,重点突出</u>,是考生备考理想的复习材料。我们希望本书不但能帮助考生逾越单词记忆这一难关,更重要的是给考生提供一种事半功倍的高效学习词汇的方法,使考生顺利通过考试,取得高分。

本书的编写人员均是同等学力申硕辅导班的老师,他们常年跟踪历年考题的变化走向,有丰富的辅导经验,对考题中词汇的重点、难点和考生在学词、记词、用词方面存在的问题都有比较全面的了解。张锦芯教授为本书的编写提出了很多宝贵意见,赵艳清同志协助编写了其中部分内容,人大出版社的马胜利、李天英、李国庆、谢晓春同志对该书的策划和出版做了大量工作,在此,我们一并表示衷心的感谢。

限于水平和时间,疏漏和失误在所难免,欢迎广大同仁和读者批评指正。
