
GRE字彙解析及記憶法




前言

GRE字彙閱讀部分滿分800分,而中國考生未超過400分者仍佔多數。而美國考生此部份能高達700分,甚至印度考生也考到650分以上(編者在德州奧斯汀大學任教時,見到很多印度及新加玻考生在此部份均獲高分)。此除GRE字彙遠較TOEFL字彙艱深外,另學習英文根基不深,及記了又忘,亦是主因。須知在GRE中欲出類拔萃,突破2000分大關,則必在字彙部分下工夫。

本書每字皆透過字源分析,讓讀者能輕鬆而有效率的熟記字彙。 另有字源部分,可助讀者旁徵博引,短期間學到大量字彙。甚至將來 遭遇未知之字,亦可透過字源法則,一窺其義。

研習本書,對于字首、字根,不宜片斷地死記,而應從已熟知的字中來認識它們,例如:




從已知的 reluctant 中認識字根 luct 為"struggle"之義,對于不情願的事物,當然會 struggle against it ; 進而可知另一深度較高的字 The luctable 即意謂"that cannot be struggled out",既是不能挣扎出的,即為"無可避免的"。如此,許多高難度的字彙,透過字源分析,即可迎双而解。(這是編者在德州教導外籍學生及返

國在美加教授中國學生所體會的心得)。

此外,本書除傳統的同義解說外,並針對VERBAL之Antonym部 分增加反義字部份,旨在讓讀者平日即能熟悉正、反義字的關係,俾 在有限的考試時間中迅速選出適合的答案。

另附錄中的諧音記憶法,透過想像力以活潑、詼諧的方式幫助讀者記憶字彙,並期能拋磚引玉,激發讀者往後在研習字彙時的聯想力。附錄二的視覺記憶法,將抽象的字彙具體化,亦有益于加深印象。目錄三之Wordlist 更可供讀者,在閱畢本書後做快速復習之用。
