前言

选文"真"。物有真假,文章亦然。假文章虽然也有文字,但却没有思想,更不是真理。只有真情方能感人,只有真话才能服人,本书选文充分反映学生在西方文化和社会背景下的真实生活。

选文"新"。王羲之诗云:"群籟虽参差,适我无非新。"没有新意的文章,不是克隆就是垃圾。本书所选文章思想新、内容新、语言新、手法新。它是汩汩淙淙的泉溪,喝一口沁人心脾;它是顶花带刺儿的黄瓜,咬一口颊齿留芳;它是敷满白霜的葡萄,吃一颗"余音绕梁"!

One morning a **mailman** walked up to a house. He rang the bell.


A few seconds later a window of the house opened, and a woman put her head out
