前 言

在 IELTS、TOEFL、GRE、GMAT、LSAT、TOEIC 等各种国外英语考试中至关重要。对于已经选择了出国留学之路的人来说,英语单词既是你前进道路上最大的障碍,又是你勇气和耐力的试金石。既然这一障碍是我们走向辉煌的人生所不可回避的,那就面对它、了解它、战胜它,让我们成为傲立潮头的成功者而不是半途而费的失败者。本书的特色介绍如下:

- 一、收词权威经典。本书从 IELTS、TOEFL、GRE、GMAT、LSAT、TOEIC 等各种国外英语考试的历年真题中精选了 5000 词汇。所有词汇均为 IELTS、TOE-FL、GRE、GMAT、LSAT、TOEIC 等出国考试中出现频率最高的词汇,记熟这些单词和词组,即可以迅速提高考试时的阅读水平,快速提高成绩;又有助于提高写作水平。相信大家在学习的同时会发现自己做考试真题的正确率及速度正逐渐提高。本手册中的精选词汇再加上[联想]中的词汇,可达到 2 万词汇量。
- 二、本书对几乎所有的单词,都加了英文解释,这些精心挑选出来的解释来自于如 Webster's New World Dictionary, Random House Webster's Dictionary, Webster's New World Thesaurus 以及大量的各类同义词词典,因此确保了单词释义的正确。
- 三、本书在释义的同时加上了各单词的大量同义词,使学生在背单词时即突出了重点,又扩大了词汇量,有助于学生潜移默化地把单词轻松背熟。

四、本书精心挑选了很多例句,使学生通过例句的学习明确知道单词在上下文之中的用法,为考试答题打下良好的基础。

五、词条条目详细,真正体现词汇学习的多功能性。每个单词包含同根词、派生词、形近易混词:有的词会在不同的场合中多次出现,有助于加强记忆。

六、本书收录了 IELTS、TOEFL、GRE、GMAT、LSAT、TOEIC 等各种国外英语考试中常备的词根、词缀以及英语中常用的词根、词缀,这是本书的精华所在。在参考了许多权威词汇书籍的基础上,笔者尽了最大的努力拆分注解了大部分单词,从而使得这些单词都能够有血有肉的呈现在读者的面前,不再是一堆字母的堆积。这里笔者真心希望更多的读者能够借此熟悉并掌握英语词根,词缀的科学记忆方法,为今后漫游英语词汇的海洋打下坚实的基础。

由于水平有限,错误疏漏在所难免,希望广大读者不吝赐教,以待再版时改正!
