前 言

“高等学校英语应用能力考试”是按照教育部颁发的“高职高专英语课程教学基本要求”而设置的考试，自 1988 年以来，已在全国大多数省份逐步推开，深受广大高职高专学生的欢迎和社会的认可。

本书为“听力理解”分册，全书的主要内容及特点是：

① 严格按照教育部颁发的“高等学校英语应用能力考试大纲”所规定的标准选编材料，语言规范，内容新颖，富有时代感。

② 全书共有十四套试题，前十套为主题训练，每套都有不同的场景；后四套为综合模拟测试。全书共有测试题 700 道。

③ 每套试题均有五部分，题型与真题完全一致，难易程度与真题基本相同，其中的 Section A，Section B 为 B 级题型；Section C，Section D，Section E 为 A 级题型。

④ 附有每套试题的录音文字材料及所有试题的参考答案。

⑤ 配有录音磁带，由外籍专家朗读，语言标准，声音清晰。
