前 言

2003 年 11 月,美国海外护士院校毕业生委员会(The Commission on Graduates of Foreign Nursing School,简称 CGFNS) 将在中国举行第一次考试。以后,中国和全球其他 48 个国家及地区一样,将在每年一月、七月和十一月举行 3 次考试。对于那些有志于到欧美国家寻求发展、开拓自己事业的青年人来说,这无疑是个福音。为了帮助有志于海外从事护理工作人士能够早日通过 CGFNS资格考试,实现自己的梦想,我们精心编写了这套教材,本书是这套教材的第一本。

全书共分对话、试题分析和附录3个部分。每个部分都自成一体,又相互关联。第一部分通过张莉、陈玲和王明之间的对话,比较详细地介绍了中国护士在美国的学习、生活和工作情况以及CGFNS的资格考试、中美护理之间的不同、美国的医疗制度、护士节的由来、美国有关护理的规章制度等。第二部分通过分析精心挑选的试题,详细地介绍了CGFNS的资格考试的覆盖范围、所占比例、可能出现的题型、如何做出正确的选择以及如何准备考试,在第十六单元还收编了自测题。附录收录了相关的网址、需要护士的一些单位和自测题的答案。全书有以下特点:

◇ 对话精彩,情节曲折:本书对话与对话之间并非无任何关 联,而是涉及张莉、陈玲和王明三人的亲身经历,既有精彩 的对话,又有扣人心弦的故事情节。通过他们的对话,既 可以提高英语听力水平,又可以了解与海外护理相关的知 识。

- ◇ 内容丰富,涉及面广: 不管是对话,还是试题分析,内容不 仅涉及到考试的方方面面,还涉及到中国人在美国的生活 情况、中美在护理方面存在的不同、美国的医疗制度等。 有利于欲在海外从事护理工作人士在去美国前,对美国医 院护理工作能有一个比较全面的了解。
- ◇ 试题分析详尽独到:本书第二部分对 CGFNS 的资格考试 所涉及的护理过程和病人的 4 种护理需要作了详细的分 析;每一部分都以例题说明问题,所有的例题都是从数千 道题目中精选出来的。

本书适用于准备参加 CGFNS 资格考试的所有人员,或医学院校和护士学校的在校学生,以提高英语水平并了解 CGFNS 的资格考试。

Section One Dialogue

Unit 1 New to U.S.A. 初来乍到

General introduction of the main characters

This is the very beginning of this book, and for the convenience of our readers we would like to present some basic information about the three characters who will appear in every unit from now on.

Zhang Li, Chen Ling and Wang Ming have all passed the nursing knowledge examination held by CGFNS (The Commission on Graduates of Foreign Nursing School), and they have also passed the TOFEL exam. So they all have acquired the CGFNS Certificate and now they are working in a hospital in Los Angeles in the United States as the registered nurses. Chen Ling and Zhang Li have immigrated into the U.S. along with their children and husbands, while Wang Ming's girlfriend is now still a graduate student working on a master's degree in Fudan University in Shanghai.

It is necessary to have some idea about CGFNS. CGFNS, The Commission on Graduates of Foreign Nursing School, is a nonofficial, nonprofit independent organization. It was founded in 1977 and is headquartered in Pennsylvania, U.S.A.. The immigration law of the U.S. states that all the foreign nurses who want to come to the U.S. to do the same job

must first of all be holders of CGFNS Certificate, no matter what kind of visas they are holding — working visas or professional immigrant visas.

Now you've learned something about the three, and they would love to share their new immigrant life with you.

Chen: Hi, Lily, has your husband got a job? And is there any trouble for your child to go to school?

Zhang: Oh, dear! It's easy for my child to go to school. As you know, in the U.S., children always go to the schools near their homes.

Chen: Oh, yeah, I know. You don't need to pay the fee in public schools, and even the lunch fee can be waived for low-income families.

Zhang: But my husband is a big problem. He used to be an honorable doctor in Shanghai, but he cannot find a job in the hospitals here because of his poor English. Now the only job he can find is to wash dishes in a Chinese restaurant.

Chen: Well, I think the pay is good.

Zhang: But you know, he always feels so frustrated and has such a grievance against me. He's always saying that he would not have come here to suffer so much but for my insistence on being a registered nurse in the United States. He sighs and groans all day and gives me a sullen look at home. I would rather stay longer here in the hospital.

Unit 2 Hard Nut to Crack 家家有本难念的经

Zhang: Last time, we talked about some problems of my family life in the U.S.. Ling, has your husband adjusted well to the new life?

Chen: Each family has its hard nut to crack. My husband used to be an insurance agent at home. He started the business rather early and had a lot of clients.

We know the law states that minorities can speak their mother tongues in working place, but we are new here, we would like to speak more of English to be melted into this group.

Chen: Wang Ming, has your girlfriend written to you?

Wang: Come on, who writes letters in a digital age? We send email to each other every day and I often call her. Do you know that it's much more cheaper to call Shanghai from the U.S. than to call the U.S. from Shanghai?

Zhang: Wang Ming, you've left your sweet-and-twenty girlfriend alone in Shanghai, don't you worry that others will steal her heart?

Wang: Couldn't be. We've been in love with each other for several years, so our relationship is pretty sound. She said she would come to the U.S. after she acquires the master's degree. Let's get down to business now. Many friends in the medical field have asked us about CGFNS nursing knowledge examination. I think we'd better turn to that, OK?

Chen: OK, but I don't think there is much time left now. And it's better for the readers to have a systematic idea about the whole thing.

Zhang: Let's start giving them a systematic lecture from next time.
