

2010年11月,浙江省教育考试院修订并印发了《浙江省大学英语三级考试大纲》, 并决定自2011年12月起,按照修订后的考纲组织命题和考试工作。

当我们把通知传达给学生时,学生们无奈地说:"老师,我们其实真的希望能学好英语,但是以前的基础实在太差了,现在考三级越来越难,我们怎么办呢?"这种困惑相信也是每一个面对或指导三级考生的教师所共同面临的问题。虽然我们并不赞成应试教育,但是通过考试能学到知识则是肯定的。从我们自己多年的英语学习、考试经历,以及后来的英语教学经验总结来看,语言虽然在日新月异的变化中,但是语言点仍然是学习的基础,而这些基本知识并没有很大变化。

基于这种理念,我们编写了这本考前强化训练书。
