
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前言

2010 年 11 月,浙江省教育考试院修订并印发了《浙江省大学英语三级考试大纲》,并决定自 2011 年 12 月起,按照修订后的考纲组织命题和考试工作。

当我们把通知传达给学生时,学生们无奈地说:“老师,我们其实真的希望能学好英语,但是以前的基础实在太差了,现在考三级越来越难,我们怎么办呢?”这种困惑相信也是每一个面对或指导三级考生的教师所共同面临的问题。虽然我们并不赞成应试教育,但是通过考试能学到知识则是肯定的。从我们自己多年的英语学习、考试经历,以及后来的英语教学经验总结来看,语言虽然在日新月异的变化中,但是语言点仍然是学习的基础,而这些基本知识并没有很大变化。

基于这种理念,我们编写了这本考前强化训练书。

本书共有 10 套强化训练试题。每一套试题的内容、题型和分值比例如下:

根据考纲,第三部分综合测试中,篇章问答和句子翻译两种题型二选一,每次考试选择一种。为便于学生训练,本书的每份试卷中,这两种题型均同时出现,教师在测试学生或学生在自测时可以选择一种来做,也可以适当延长时间两种题型都做。

本书具有以下特色:

一、注重精确, 便于理解

在结合作者丰富的辅导经验的基础上, 博采众长, 帮助学生进行系统的考前强化学习、训练和巩固。所谓精确, 体现在两个方面: 一是试题的难易程度与考纲要求的一致性高, 有很好的预测功能; 二是附录中的试题详解释义精到, 并伴有许多解题技巧, 便于学习。学生仔细体会, 必能大幅度地提高英语运用水平。

二、紧扣新大纲, 充分体现了科学性、实用性和针对性

本书取材广泛, 内容新颖, 紧跟时代潮流, 信息量大, 覆盖了三级考试的全部内容, 可使学生在最短的时间内了解三级考试的全貌, 包括题型、题量、难易度。学生可利用训练试题促进学习, 发现自身的不足, 找出差距, 并通过反复练习, 提高熟练程度, 迅速提高三级英语应试能力, 从而快速提高英语三级应考成绩。

本书的听力试题配有 MP3 音频文件, 特约美国专家录制。音质纯真, 语音清晰, 速度与考试要求一致。
