





A country (or **state**) has a government. In some countries the **head of state** is the same as the **head of government**, e.g. the **President** of the United States. In other countries they are separate, e.g. in China the President is the head of state and the **Prime Minister** is the head of government. In **republics**, the head of state is a president, but in **monarchies**, the head of state is a **king**, **queen** or **emperor**. The heads of the main government departments are called **ministers** or **secretaries**. China is divided into a number of **provinces**. In some countries with a **federal** system these provinces have a lot of freedom, and are called **states** (e.g. the U.S.A., Australia and Canada). A country has a national song, called its **national anthem**.
