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— 前 言 —

国务院学位办于2012年7月公布了同等学力申请硕士学位英语水平考试第六版大纲。与第五版相比,新版大纲在词汇方面作了比较大的调整,将词汇考查总量从原来的6 220个调整到6 000个,词组由600个提高到700个,积极词汇由2 360个提高到2 800个。词汇要求的变化具体分析如下。

1. 新版大纲虽然将词汇量由6 220个减到6 000个,但与第五版大纲对比,第六版大纲新增词汇705个,显然词汇的变化实际上绝不是简单的删除了220个词。词组也是如此。新版大纲新增词组240个左右,也非简单的增加100个。积极词汇的变化更不例外。新版大纲新增积极词汇934个,同样不仅仅是算数意义上的加减法问题。

2. 从词汇内容范围看,新版大纲给出了每个词条考生应该掌握的词义范围、词性;而旧版大纲则没有这些内容。这意味着对考生来说,更加明确了每个词条应该掌握到什么程度,对考查范围更加清楚了。

3. 新增词汇有一部分常见国家、地区的名称,原来这些词列在附录中,新版大纲将它们改列在了词条内,这意味着新增词汇中有一部分考生早已熟悉,无所谓新词。

4. 新版大纲附录列出了要求考生必须掌握的常见130多个前后缀,而且大纲样题词汇部分就有加词缀的画线考点词。这意味着考生必须熟悉这些词缀,否则无法辨认不包括在词条内的派生词。

尽人皆知,词汇是在各类英语考试中取得理想成绩的关键。为了帮助考生复习备考,我们根据第六版考试大纲规定的词汇,对《同等学力人员申请硕士学位英语水平全国统一考试词汇精记速记》一书做了较大的修订,所有词条完全出自于最新版大纲。在编写方式上,我们针对同等学力考生群体社会阅历丰富、知识面宽、理解能力强、善于思考等特点,结合多年英语教学和辅导考试的实践经验,打破传统的完全按照字母顺序大排队的方式,将大纲词汇按考查重点和难度划分为四大部分,每部分内的选词按字母顺序排列,便于考生了解常考词、难点词、易混词,分轻重缓急投入复习时间和精力。具体标准与编写思路如下。

1. 第一部分是重点、难点词。我们以1995—2014年所有词汇题的选项为主,辅以阅读中的难点词,整理、筛选出近1 200个左右重点、难点词,并对这些词进行详细讲解,例句说明用法,近义反义联想链接,目的是使考生熟练掌握这部分词,不但认知,而且会用。

2. 第二部分为一般性认知词汇。这部分词出现频率较低,出现在词汇单选题目中的几率很小,对于它们,考生只要认识、知道大致意思,根据上下文猜出词义,模糊理解即可。所以这部分讲解中我们舍去了例句,用短语取而代之,通过同义词、反义词、派生词来增加词汇的重现率,以达到举一反三、串联记忆的效果。

3. 第三部分是大纲规定的700个词组,我们给这些词组加了例句,便于考生加深理解并使用。

4. 第四部分是基础词汇,我们挑选出2 000个左右考生在初高中时就学过的、最基本的词

汇，将它们单列出来，只给词性、词义，节省版面，减少书的厚度。对于这部分词汇，考生一般只需要过一遍就能完全回忆起来，这样可以大大节省考生复习时间。

5. 最后是附录。除了大纲附录中列出的内容外，我们还增加了常用词根的讲解，帮助考生学习词汇记忆方法，以便快速记词，扩大词汇量。

总之，本书在涵盖新大纲全部词汇的基础上，有点有面，重点突出，是考生备考理想的复习材料。我们希望本书不但能帮助考生逾越单词记忆这一难关，而且更重要的是给考生提供一种事半功倍的高效学习词汇的方法，使考生顺利通过考试，取得高分。

本书的编写人员均是同等学力申硕辅导班的老师，他们常年跟踪历年考题的变化走向，有丰富的辅导经验，对考题中词汇的重点、难点和考生在学词、记词、用词方面存在的问题都有比较全面的了解。张锦芯教授为本书的编写提出了很多宝贵意见，赵艳清同志协助编写了其中部分内容，人大出版社的李天英、李国庆、谢晓春同志对该书的策划和出版做了大量工作，在此，我们一并表示衷心的感谢。

限于水平和时间，本书疏漏和失误在所难免，欢迎广大同仁和读者批评指正。
