吴中东 宫玉波 王 谨 柳 青 周 新 张立新李 青 杨 俊 滕继萌 徐 慧 王莉娅 汪文娟 幸君珺 钟厚涛 朱 篱 李 倩 对于备战英语专业四级考试的考生来说,大量做题无疑是最佳策略,但 2004 年考试大纲修改之后的真题还不到十套,如果能有高质量的模拟试题集无疑会给考生带来很大的帮助。《模拟题详解》的出版正是出于这样的考虑。本书包含六套高仿真模拟试题,给考生提供大量的训练机会,从而使考生不仅在语言方面得到提高,还能提高解题能力,达到在考试时应对自如的程度,最终提高考试成绩。本书具有以下特色:

一、紧扣考纲、吃透考题

本书除了严格按照《高校英语专业四级考试大纲》的规定编写之外,还精心研究近几年真题出题思路,正确把握考题的脉络走向,使试题尽可能接近真题。例如本书的语法部分增加了有关语法功能及使用的内容,词汇部分增加了成语和固定搭配,阅读部分则增加了难度。

二、题源类似, 题型逼真

本书的语料和真题一样来源于英美权威报纸杂志,例如阅读理解部分的材料来源包括近两年的 The New York Times, The Washington Post, Reader's Digest, National Geographic Magazine, The Economist, The Wall Street Journal, Newsweek, The Telegraph、The Independent等,从而保证了文章体裁多样性、时效性和思想性。本书还深入透彻地研究了真题类型,题型不仅包括细节题,还包括了推断题、归纳题、态度题、逻辑衔接题等较难题型。通过大量的练习,考生可以提高题型的解读意识,根据不同题型有针对性地进行解题。

三、精心解析, 中英对照

本书答案部分,无论是听写、选择题还是作文,都有详尽的解析。对许多选择题的正误选项都作了讲解,使答案明明白白,同时也提高考生的辨析能力。本书的一大特色就是选择题答案解析的出处用中英文对照的形式给出,这不仅方便读者,而且帮助读者加深对英语原文的理解。

四、追求完善, 树立标杆

本书的每一道题目都经过精心设计,缜密不疏;每一道题的解答都做到条分缕析,精准到位;作文例文更是字斟句酌,行文流畅,文笔优美。不是真题,胜似真题,这就是本书所追求的目标。

总之,本书选材新颖,题型逼真,难易度适中,解析详尽,可以使考生无师自通, 夯实英语基础,树立答题的自信心,是英语专业四级考试考前冲刺的绝佳教材。


