



Li Ming: Mom! It's only two hundred seventy-eight kilometres from Shijiazhuang to Beijing!


Mom: Okay, Li Ming! You are a good boy, and you work hard in school. You may go. I will go, too!

Mom: Yes, you may. You ask too many questions, Li Ming.


Li Ming: Sorry, Mom. May I live in Beijing? Beijing is so great!

Oh, please, Mom? Please! Please! Mrs. Smith: Yes, Jenny can come. And I can talk to Danny's mother.




Mrs. Smith: When do you leave for Beijing?

Mrs. Li: In the afternoon on February 1st.




