 - 5. 本刊不设稿酬,来稿一经采用刊登,即赠5本样刊。

- 1. 采用页下注。
- 2. 引用古籍应依次标明作者书名、卷别、篇名。常见书可略作者。如:

[唐]欧阳询《艺文类聚》卷四一《乐部一・论乐》。

《隋书》卷二四《食货志》。

《全唐诗》卷五四〇,李商隐《洞庭鱼》。

除先秦古籍外,引用古籍,一般不采用书名加间隔号加篇名形式(如《宋史·食货志》)。 正文中为行文方便,可采用书名加间隔号加篇名形式,但在注释中仍应加注卷别。

3. 引用近人著作应依次标明作者、书名、出版社、出版年月、页码。如:

唐长孺:《魏晋南北朝史论丛》,三联书店 1955 年版,第158~161页。

4. 引用近人论文,应依次标明作者、论文题目、报刊名称、刊期(或日期)。如:

周一良:《关于崔浩国史之狱》,《中华文史论丛》1980年第4辑。

谢重光:《略论唐代寺院、僧尼免赋特权的逐步丧失》,载何兹全主编:《五十年来汉唐佛教寺院经济研究》,北京师范大学出版社1986年版。

Our founder's words direct the College to develop undergraduate students' intellectual and moral capacities. In pursuit of this mission, the College values a diverse community of distinguished scholars and extraordinary young women from around the world. The College prepares its graduates to apply their intellects, talents, and principles in public and private lives of integrity, service, leadership, and creativity.

Scripps College provides a distinctive and challenging Humanities Core Curriculum based on interdisciplinary studies combined with rigorous training in the liberal arts. This course of study teaches young women to think clearly in defining questions from a variety of perspectives and to develop critical approaches for the pursuit of knowledge.

Building on Scripps College's tradition of interdisciplinary humanities, the Core program is a sequence of three courses with the common theme *Histories of the Present*. The Humanities Core begins with an initial combined lecture and discussion survey course, team-taught by 12 or 13 faculty members from many different disciplines (from Arts and Letters, Social Sciences, Natural Sciences and Fine Arts). The Core's interdisciplinary nature serves to introduce the students to a number of disciplines and their approaches while allowing, and even encouraging, a skeptical awareness of the limits of disciplinary methods and theories.

The ethos of the Humanities Core Curriculum is grounded in the values of integrated and humanistic education that guided the inception of Scripps College more than 80 years ago. It is designed to teach our students how to **think** critically, how to **challenge** unexamined assumptions, and how to become women who are not afraid to **innovate**. ROBERT H. SMITH INTERNATIONAL CENTER FOR JEFFERSON STUDIES

The Robert H. Smith International Center for Jefferson Studies at Monticello offers fellowships to scholars engaged in research related to the life, era, and legacy of Thomas Jefferson.

Short-Term Residential Fellowships. Short-term fellowships are awarded for periods of up to four months. At least one fellowship will be reserved for research topics in African-American history and in archaeology for fellows using the Digital Archaeological Archive of Comparative Slavery. Each short-term fellowship carries a stipend of \$2,000 per month plus pre-approved travel costs for scholars from the United States and Canada and a stipend of \$3,000 per month plus pre-approved travel costs for international scholars. Applicants should submit a 500-word description of the project, a one-paragraph summary of the project, a résumé, and a letter of application with the number of months requested and preferred dates of residence, and arrange to have two letters of reference sent to the address below. Awards are made once yearly; the application deadline is November 1, 2013.






