



#### 前言

各种语言都有自己的习惯用法。汉语与英语属于完全不同 的语系,尤其是中国人与英美人的思维方式、民族文化、风俗习 惯、所处的地理位置等方面都有诸多差异,反映在两种语言中的 习惯用法也就大相径庭,因此英语习惯用法成了中国人学习和 运用英语的难点和疑点。而英语习惯用法却是各种英语水平测 试中的重点,无论是在我国的高考,英语专业四、八级考试,非英 语专业四、六级考试,研究生入学考试,PETS考试中,还是在美 国的 TOEFL 和 GRE 等考试中的词汇、语法、改错、完形填空等 一般都要涉及英语习惯用法。所以要想真正掌握好英语、运用 好英语、在英语考试中取得很好的成绩,学习和运用英语者必须 熟练掌握英语习惯用法。笔者从事大学英语专业教学近三十 年,在此期间一直结合教学从事英语习惯用法的研究,先后出版 了《英语惯用法 50 个为什么》(中南工业大学出版社,1988)、《最 重要的英语惯用法 50 则》(台湾笛藤图书出版有限公司,1994)、 《英语相似句辨析》(广东教育出版社,1997)、《实用分类英语惯 用法》(湖南教育出版社,1998)、《汉英习惯用法对比研究及应 用》(湖南师范大学出版社,2005)、《高级英语惯用法精华》(湖南 师范大学出版社,2006)、《中学英语习惯用法词典》(湖南师范大 学出版社,2010)、《高考英语习惯用法过关测试与精解》(湖南师 范大学出版社,2011)。与此同时,本人还先后在《中国翻译》、 《外语教学与研究》、《湖南师范大学社会科学报》、《英语辅导》、 《英语知识》等刊物上发表论文十余篇。为了让我国广大英语爱 好者尽快掌握英语习惯用法,我们特编写了《中高级英语惯用法 过关测试与精解》一书。全书共有两大部分:第一部分为 1877 道英语惯用法测试题;第二大部分为答案与精解。其中测试部 分又分为9个单元。

一、第1单元有270道选择题,内容主要涉及动词的各种惯

用搭配问题。

二、第2单元有180道动词填空题,内容主要涉及动词的惯用时态、惯用语态、惯用语气及主谓一致等问题。

三、第 3 单元有 257 对翻译题,共 514 句,内容涉及那些看起来十分相似,但意思却大相径庭的句子。

四、第 4 单元有 180 道词汇选择题,内容涉及同义词、近义词及相似词的辨析。

五、第 5 单元有 50 道反意疑问句填空题,内容涉及反意疑问句的主语、谓语动词及肯定还是否定的问题。

六、第6单元有340道介词选择题,内容涉及介词的各种习惯用法。

七、第7单元有150道冠词填空题,内容涉及冠词的各种习惯用法。

八、第8单元有300道单个改错题,内容包罗万象,主要涉及汉语的负迁移问题、动词的及物与不及物问题、倒装的问题、 名词的单数与复数问题、名词的惯用复数问题、不定式符号to的 有无问题,等等。

九、第9单元是10篇文章的综合改错(proof-reading),共有150道题。


