## 前言





#### **Writing Practice**

#### Response to a Written Invitation(邀请函的回复)



Responding to an invitation properly demonstrates your good manners, and it is also a mark of respect and consideration for your host.

Be short and be polite. Some points of writing a response for your accepting an invitation are as follows:

- 1. Say "Thank you" first, and repeat some important contents mentioned in the invitation such as time and date. For example: "I'll be delighted to attend your luncheon next Friday, May the fifth, at twelve o'clock."
- 2. Give a definite answer if you are available for being there or not. Don't write something like "I'll come if I'm in town."

#### Sample 1:

Dear Mr. Tom:

Please accept our hearty thanks for your kind invitation to your hoe dinner on Wednesday. Thank you for including us among limited number of your guests. You may be sure we will join you on that day and we are looking forward to the pleasure of being with you.

Yours sincerely,

Kate Hill

#### Some useful expressions used in a response for accepting an invitation:

We are delighted to accept...

It is with great pleasure...

We are sincerely happy to join you...

Some points of writing a response for your being unable to accept an invitation are as follows:

- 1. Say "Thank you" first for the invitee's inviting you;
- 2. Offer the detailed reasons for being unable to accept the invitation, and express your regrets;
- 3. Express your best wishes to the invitee.

#### Sample 2:

Dear Mr. Green:

We are very appreciative of your so warmly including us among your selected guests for Wednesday. Most unfortunately, however, we shall be unable to avail ourselves of your kind invitation on account of a previous engagement for the same day. I have ordered the Queen Department Store to deliver you a trifle, which please accept as a humble token of our felicitation on the party.

With best wishes for a very jolly home dinner.

Yours sincerely, Mary White
