

《英语5》、《英语6》和《英语5、6册答案和译文》是为由专科升入本科的学生编写的一套非英语 专业英语教材。本套教材继承了前几册"既注意打好英语语言基础,又注意培养学生实际使用英语进行 涉外交际能力"的学用结合的编写原则,同时还与大学英语教学大纲四级的教学要求相衔接。

《英语5》和《英语6》各包括10个单元,每个单元主要包括"阅读"、"应用文套写"、"听与说"、"自我评估"和"快乐学习"等部分。"阅读"部分分为"实用阅读"和"阅读欣赏",前者的选文着重实用性和交际性,后者的选文则注重文体的多样性和可欣赏性; "应用文套写"选用涉外交际应用文,根据所给的样例训练学生理解和套写有关英语应用文的能力; "听与说"是本套教材的重要组成部分,其中"说"突出口语涉外交际的实用需要,而"听"则注重适当拓宽听力训练的范围。考虑到有些语法难点学生不易掌握,需要不断实践巩固,而大学英语四级考试又有专门测试语法技能的要求,《英语5》保留了"语法要点"部分,运用正误对比的方式,对这些语法难点进行了归纳和专项练习。《英语6》则针对学生写作训练中常出现的结构错误编写了围绕语法技能的写作练习; "快乐学习"则是为了调节学习气氛,同时帮助学生学习欣赏幽默英语的能力。

《英语5》和《英语6》每单元的"自我评估"部分编写了与大学英语四级考试大体等值的各项语言 技能的训练练习,使学生能在整个学习过程中不断进行自我检测。《英语5》和《英语6》还分别编有两 套大学英语四级考试模拟试题,供学生作阶段性的自我综合检测使用。

为了便于教学和自学、《英语5》和《英语6》的词汇起点都是《英语4》的词汇终点。

《英语5、6册答案和译文》给出了《英语5》和《英语6》中所有练习的参考答案和课文参考译文。

总之,本套教材是为专升本的学生编写的一种极富特色的新教程,构思独特,编排新颖,比较合理 地体现了"专升本"英语教学的特色。

本册总主编为大连理工大学外语系孔庆炎教授,主编为重庆大学外语学院余渭深教授和大连理工大学外语系姜怡副教授。中央广播电视大学刘黛琳教授和孙建华老师为本书的编写提出了许多宝贵的建议和修改意见,编者在此一并表示深深的谢意。

威廉・亨利・盖茨

威廉(比尔)·亨利·盖茨是世界著名公司——个人电脑软件的主要供应商——微软公司的董事长兼总裁。微软到1998年6月为止的财政年收入为144亿美元,雇用了27000多职员、遍及60个国家。

盖茨生于1955年10月28日,和他的两个姐妹一起在西雅图长大成人。父亲是西雅图的律师,已故的母亲是位中学教师。盖茨在一所公立小学念书,后就读于私立湖畔中学,在那里他开始涉足个人电脑软件,13岁开始设计电脑程序。1973年,盖茨成为哈佛大学的学生,和微软现任总经理史蒂夫·鲍尔默同住一幢宿舍。在哈佛大学,盖茨为第一台微电脑装置 MITS 阿尔它设计了 BASIC 编程语言。大学三年级,盖茨弃学哈佛,全身心投入到微软公司——他与保罗·艾伦于1975年创办的公司。他们抱着这样的信念:个人电脑将成为每一张办公桌上和每一个家庭里有价值的工具,从而开始了个人电脑软件的开发。

盖茨对个人电脑的远见卓识是微软以及软件行业成功的关键。盖茨积极参与微软的核心管理和战略性决策,并在新产品的技术开发方面起了至关重要的作用。他还用了大量时间会见顾客,通过电子邮件与世界各地的微软员工进行联系。在盖茨的领导下,微软的使命是不断发展和改善软件技术,让软件更易操作,价格更低,让使用电脑的人乐此不疲。微软公司着眼于长期发展计划,其具体表现为本财政年度投资30多亿美元进行研究和开发新产品。

盖茨是一个读起书来废寝忘食的人,他喜爱打高尔夫球和桥牌。他于1994年1月1日与梅林达·法兰琪·盖茨结婚。盖茨夫妇在全球健康和教育领域设立了基金,希望我们在迈进21世纪时,在这些关键领域的科技进步能为所有的人服务。1999年,盖茨著书《思维速度的经商》,揭示数字程序会用崭新的方法解决问题。他与柯林斯·海明威合著的这部著作已被翻译成25种文字并销往60多个国家。它曾列于《纽约时报》、《今日美国》、《华尔街杂志》以及亚马逊网站的畅销书排行榜。盖茨的前一本书《前面的道路》于1995年出版,在《纽约时报》畅销书排行榜上名列榜首达7周之久。盖茨把这两本书的收入捐赠给了非盈利机构,来支持教育及技能开发中的技术运用。
