



Cuba Gooding Jr.

A Life of Ups and Downs

"Show me the money!"

- If you've seen the movie *Jerry Maguire*, you know that Cuba Gooding Jr.'s character *does* get his money. But even if you've never seen *Jerry Maguire*, you've probably heard someone shout out those words. It's one of the most famous lines ever uttered in a movie, and it helped make Cuba Gooding Jr. a star.
- In the movie, Gooding Jr.'s character has his ups and downs, but that's nothing compared to the roller coaster ride that Gooding Jr. went through in his own life.
- Cuba Gooding Jr. was born in 1968 in New York City, where his father began a career as a singer. When Gooding Jr. was three years old, his father joined a band called the Main Ingredient. Over the next few years, this band had several hits, including the wildly popular song "Everybody Plays the Fool." The Goodings seemed guaranteed a wonderful future, and the whole family enjoyed the benefits that came with success. Gooding Jr. rode in limousines and hung out backstage with famous performers. When his father performed at Disneyland, officials closed the park and Gooding Jr. got to ride on the merry-go-round with Janet Jackson. Says Gooding Jr., "Until I was 12, I had a pretty privileged life."
- In 1978 the family moved to California, expecting the good times to continue. But two years later, Gooding Jr.'s parents split up, and his dad left the family. Suddenly there wasn't any money for luxuries. There wasn't even enough money for basics. "Things hit rock bottom so quickly it didn't seem real," says Gooding Jr.
- Gooding Jr.'s mother struggled to find a job that would pay the bills. She became a clerk in a store, often working until midnight, but she still couldn't earn enough to pay the rent. For a while, she and her children lived in cheap hotels, but soon they couldn't even afford that. "My mother, my siblings, and I went from the good life to being homeless," says Gooding Jr. "We lived in a car for a couple of months."

- Things did not improve much over the next several years. "We moved around a lot," Gooding Jr. recalls. Sometimes the family lived with Gooding Jr.'s grandmother in the Arizona desert. "There was nothing but poverty," says Gooding Jr. "It was rough."
- Despite all this, Gooding Jr. remained surprisingly hopeful. He dreamed of becoming a star—and he vowed not to let poverty ruin his dream. All around him, people were turning to guns and drugs, but he knew he didn't want that kind of a life. "I hung out with a lot of guys who ran in gangs," he says, "but I never was a member of one."
- Instead, Gooding Jr. focused on other activities. He took any job he could find. He weeded people's gardens and sold tacos at a taco stand. He worked as a clerk in a mall. He also got a job as a telemarketer, trying to sell people products over the telephone.
- Having those jobs meant some very long days for Gooding Jr. "At one point in my life, I was getting on a bus at 6:00 in the morning, at school by 7:30, doing my homework for about 45 minutes before school started, and going until 3:00. I did a couple more hours of homework on the bus going to work, and then I worked from 5:00 to 11:00," says Gooding Jr. He took the bus back home, and it was often 1:00 in the morning before he got to bed. "I did this all week long," he says.
- Because his family moved so frequently, Gooding Jr. went to four different high schools. Yet at each new school, he managed to do well. At three of his four schools he was elected class president!
- Gooding Jr. got his first taste of show business in 1984, when he was chosen to be a break dancer at the closing ceremonies of the 1984 Olympics. Soon after that, he performed in a high school play. A parent in the audience-

happened to be a Hollywood agent. The agent was impressed with Gooding Jr.'s performance and offered to help him get acting jobs.

Over the next few years, Gooding Jr. landed several small roles in TV shows and appeared in a couple of commercials. But his first big success came in 1991, with *Boyz N the Hood*. In this movie, Gooding Jr. proved that he was an actor to be taken seriously. His portrayal of a young man trying to get out of South Central Los Angeles impressed many people.

After *Boyz N the Hood*, Gooding Jr. hoped a wide variety of roles would come his way. "I wanted to be a cowboy, I wanted to be a pirate, I wanted to be a businessman," he says. Hollywood didn't have that many good roles for African American actors, however, and Gooding Jr. found himself looking at more roles like the one he played in *Boyz*. He says, "The scripts I got were *Boyz N the Hood 2 . . . Boyz N the Hood Goes to Heaven, Boyz N the Hood Goes to the Laundromat, Boyz at the Supermarket.*" Gooding Jr. didn't want to be typecast as a gang member, so he rejected all these roles.

In 1996 he finally saw his chance. Gooding Jr. wanted to play Rod Tidwell, the football player in *Jerry Maguire* whose favorite expression is "Show me the money!" He auditioned and convinced the director to hire him. It was a good decision: Gooding Jr. turned in an Oscar-winning performance.

After *Jerry Maguire*, Gooding Jr. starred in many other movies, including *Pearl Harbor* (2001) and *Radio* (2003). Today he is one of the biggest stars in Hollywood. Yet he remains the cheerful, friendly person he has always been. Gooding Jr. knows from experience that success doesn't always last, so he has put much of his energy into building a good life beyond the big screen. He has been married to his high-school sweetheart since 1994, and they have two sons, Spencer and Mason.

Gooding Jr. is grateful for his family, his health, and his current good fortune. He is thankful for all that he has—and he tries to squeeze all the happiness he can out of each day. As he says, "Every day above ground is a good one, man."
