近年来,海峡两岸高校合作办学的力度不断加大,大陆学生 赴台学习的机会越来越多,赴台学习的学生人数持续增长。台 湾高校大多选用英文版教材,教师多用英文授课,这对赴台学生 的英语能力提出了更高的要求。为了满足两岸高校教育合作的 要求,配合有关高校开展专业合作,提升合作专业学生的英语听 说水平,促进两岸人才合作交流及可持续发展,福建工程学院海 峡工学院大学英语教学团队的骨干教师编写了闽台合作教育系 列辅助教材,本书是该系列辅助教材之一。

全书分为5章,每章8个单元,每个单元均包括以下4个部分。

1. 热身活动(Before Listening Activities)

与主题相关的热身问答(Warm-up Questions)和语言文化要点学习(Language and Culture Tips)。一方面,让学生在听之前对本单元的内容有所了解,使他们在大脑中形成一定的内容图式;另一方面,扫除学习者在听力理解过程中可能遇到的语言或文化障碍,以便提高学生听力理解的效率、自信心和跨文化交际能力。

### 2. 听力练习(Listening Activities)

泛听(Listening for Gist)和精听(Listening for Specific Information)。要求学习者第一遍听懂短文大意;第二篇听懂短文的具体内容。无论是泛听还是精听,都配有听力理解练习。

### 3. 口语练习(Speaking Activities)

半控制性口语练习和开放性口语练习。半控制性口语练习就是运用听力短文中出现的短语或表达法,说一段话或讲一个故事;开放性口语练习就是围绕书中所提供的开放性问题展开讨论,进一步训练和提高学习者的英语口头表达能力。

### 4. 课后练习(Follow-up Activities)

模仿朗读和自由阐述。一方面,学习者通过模仿朗读,改进并完善自己的英语发音和英语语调;另一方面,以听力文本为核心内容,进行自由自主的话题阐述、观点交流或角色扮演,让学习者自信开口,有话可说。

另外,书后附有听力原文(Script)、听力练习答案(Keys to Listening Exercises)和语音语调(Phonetics & Intonation),便于学习者进行自我检查和自我考核,掌握正确的英语语音语调及英语语言节律。

李艳玲老师担任本书的主编,负责全书统稿。赵明玉老师和胡萍英教授担任副主编,负责拟定提纲、组织编写和协调等工作。胡萍英、张炜、陈琴、李艳玲、赵明玉5位老师分别负责编写本书的第1章~第5章。

本书的编写得到了福建工程学院领导、外语系领导和海峡 工学院领导的关心、指导和支持,在此,致以衷心的感谢。

由于时间仓促,编者水平有限,书中不妥之处在所难免,恳请广大读者及同行批评指正。
