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
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PREFACE

序言

Bars, nightclubs, and lounges are playgrounds. They are favorite places of escaping, opportunities to play out our public identity, to exercise a lifestyle of entertainment, spectacle and display. A further recognizable trend is the tendency to create spaces which are seamless and integrated, where the structural, mechanical, lighting, and sound systems perform without overbearing the purely formal design systems.

The projects in the following pages portend an ever-evolving scenario of exciting developments.

Enjoy this parade of extraordinary venues where visitors quench their desire to be on stage and reach a new exciting state, full of anticipation.

We bring that larger vision down to the very minute details of a bar, always keeping focused on interaction." The goal in bar design is to create a venue where guests are encouraged to relinquish their inhibitions and step through the looking glass to experience an alternate reality for the night.

The atmosphere at ICRAVE-designed bars is curated using state-of-the-art AV systems that seduce patrons while they dance the night away.

To create a more intimate bar, we often design a central space and tiered seating lay out allowing for a see-and-be-seen environment where the energy is focused to the middle of the room. This allows the space to flow in such a way that patrons have multiple options for discovery and interaction. The ICRAVE design team always pushes the envelope on inventing spaces that allow individuals to experience explore and more importantly become a part of the environments they are visiting.

The concept born from the entrance, the facade is a large screen and its base has irregular seats that are connected to the reception through a tunnel of arrows, a fully isolated box of enclosure strips on floor and ceiling. Inside the juxtaposition of old structures serve as the motive of the project, plans continued to arise from the floor and wrap up the walls and ceilings of various sizes. A huge bar that winds through the walls integrating the three bars as one, using the bottles as monitors, reflecting the textures, colors and lights. The track is sunk as if it was a theater. The niches located next to the track reinterpret a railroad car. The project takes up forgotten items and materials, giving a new expression and incorporating the project as an experiment: velvets, tergal, glass mirror, carpeted walls, glass spheres, curves, etc. are some of the materials used to emphasize the concept. The colors are now of completely lively.









































本案设计理念源于入口处, 其 外立面是一个大屏幕, 底层放置了很 多不规则座位。穿过画满箭头的通 道,一直通往前台,便进入到一个完 全独立的包厢, 天花板和地板被带状 图案所围绕。设计主旨体现在内部并 排放置的古旧设施中, 图案从地板一 直向上延伸, 包裹住不同面积的墙壁 和天花板。一个巨大的吧台蜿蜒穿过 墙壁, 令三个酒吧间合而为一, 并用 酒瓶来映射出质地、色彩和灯光。酒 吧内的过道像电影院里的一样拾阶而 下。设置在过道旁的壁龛重新诠释了 火车车厢的形象。本案把那些被人遗 忘的物品和材料纳入设计中, 并给予 其全新的表达,就像在做试验: 天鹅 绒、泰格尔纤维、玻璃镜面、软包的 墙壁、玻璃球、曲线等等,都被用做 强调设计理念的材料。酒吧的色彩非 常鲜活。

The theme lies in the exaltation of the irregularities of the existing form, that are intertwined in multiple directions as an irregularly folded paper that is wrapped around a space, born from the outside with a box that floats and throws against access by generating the entrance, as a deep red envelope. The intensity is turned off when passing through the tunnel. Everything becomes completely gentle and pure white when entering. These docile and pure lines gradually transform themselves and break to finish within a chaos of enveloping grey and red. Everything here is exciting, and there are no walls or ceilings but a broken cover and bright and segmented images. The cabin spaces, walls and furniture are in a powerful, bright red, and the walls are segmented images that emphasize the concept.
