本书是英国文学史及选读教材习题集。编著者针对英国文学史及作品设计了各种各样的练习,主要有选择填空、找错并改错、辨认、配对、回答问题等形式,内容翔实、全面,能帮助读者全面了解和掌握英国文学史及作品。

本书读者对象为:英语专业高年级学生、高等教育自学考试英语专业本科生、函授本科生、三沟通本科生、报考英美文学专业研究生的考生和广大英国文学爱好者。

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前 言

我国大学英语专业高年级、高等教育自学考试英语专业本科段、英语专业函授本科、三沟通本科均开设英美文学史及选读课。全国各级各类出版社已出版大量有关教材,为学生学习和教师教学提供了方便。但是,学生常常感到文学课太难学,苦于无练习可做,不能检验学习效果,考前复习时也不方便。基于这种情况,我们编写了《美国文学学习指南》和《英国文学习指南》。

《英国文学学习指南》以外语教学与研究出版社出版的 吴伟仁教授编写的教材为基本蓝本,练习划分成 9 个部分,与 原教材的时代划分相对应,另外附加一个针对全书而出的配 对练习。编写过程中,我们参考了国内外专家编写的英国文学 史及选读教材,对吴教授教材的内容进行了补充,使我们编的 这本练习书尽量内容翔实,以便使学生在学完本书后对英国 文学及作品有一较全面的掌握。

本书部分练习曾在学生中试用,效果不错,很受欢迎,这 更坚定了我们编写本书的信心。

《英国文学学习指南》共分两编。第一编为文学史部分,第二编为选读部分,这两编针对英国文学史上的重点作家及重点作品设计了各种各样的练习,主要有选择填空、找错并改错、配对、辨认、简答等形式。需说明的是,我们把 Hardy 从Part IX (The Twentieh-Century Literature) 移到 Part William

(The Victorian Age)。另外,在选择和配对练习中,我们有时列了一些非英国的作家和作品,一是作为干扰项,二是因为它们彼此相关。
