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前 言

高级英语系列教程《IELTS 考试技能训练教程》(以下简称《教程》)是北京语言文化大学出国人员培训部数名教员以七年多的对 IELTS 考生进行应考培训的经验为基础对 IELTS 考试进行细致分析之后编写而成的。《教程》共分四册:

《听力》

《口语》

《阅读》

《写作》

《教程》具有以下特点:

1. 针对性强:《教程》针对 IELTS 考试而编写,读者对象为准备参加 IELTS 考试的人。通过做练习可使读者熟悉 IELTS 试题的模式,同时发现自己的弱点,做到知己知彼。

2. 练习形式多样化:IELTS 考试与其他几种英语考试(如 TOEFL、EPT)相比,具有题型更加多样化的特点。这些题型并不统一地存在于各次 IELTS 考试中。因此,熟悉各种题型是在考试中取得理想分数的一个关键。《教程》为读者提供了有针对性的、系统的训练,可使读者在考试中更好地发挥自己的能力。

3. 练习经过多年试用:《教程》中所有练习均在北京语言文化大学出国人员培训部经过使用和改进,在教学中收到良好的效果,受到学生的普遍欢迎,并得到英、美专家的指正,是作者多年辛勤工作的结晶。

4. 练习题材广泛:《教程》练习内容涉及生活中的许多方面以及自然科学和社会科学的多个领域,适用于从事各类工作的人。

5. 亦适用于参加其他考试的人:近年来语言教学理论强调语言能力而不是语言知识,强调语言的使用而不是用法。这些理论对语言测试亦有颇大影响。《教程》遵循 IELTS 考试的指导思想,注重培养学生使用英语、特别是以英语为工具从事专业学习和研究的能力。这种能力对参加任何英语考试都至关重要。

《教程》经过七年的孕育终于和读者见面,了却作者的一桩心事。但因恐“误人子弟”之怨,心情并未由此而轻松许多,因为书中难免有失误和不妥之处。欢迎读者提出意见。

《IELTS 考试技能训练教程·听力》简介

《IELTS 考试技能训练教程·听力》是为参加 IELTS 英语听力测试的学生进行短期强化训练而设计的。它不但有助于短期内提高学生的应试能力，同时也可以作为英语专业学生的听力专项训练用书。

本教程内容丰富，涉及广泛，取材于英语国家生活和学习的实际场景，内容按照先易后难循序渐进编排。全书分为“学生用书”和“教师用书”，便于自学。

一、学生用书

“学生用书”共分为六个单元，前五个单元提供了听力专项练习，它们是模拟 IELTS 考题的题型进行分类设置的。

第一单元练习以数字练习为主，选材于实际生活中与数字有关的对话和报告。例如：时间、旅行时刻表、地址、电话号码及科研学术报告中的数据等。

第二单元练习是注重听与写的专项练习。通过旅行住宿登记、电话记录和填写各类表格的形式，训练学生捕捉主要信息并记录下来的能力。

第三单元是视与听专项练习。试图检测学生对于听力材料理解的能力。

第四、五单元为综合性练习。要求学生在听懂和理解的基础上进行概括整理，并以扼要的短语回答问题、补全信息，或者做多项选择和是非选择题。

第六单元编辑了六套模拟试题。前四套试题是根据英国文化协会近两年提供的 IELTS 考题模拟设计的。第五套和第六套试题是根据最新题型设计而成的。

我们建议：学生在开始学习本教程前，可以先做模拟试题，检查自己的英语水平，找到自己听力上的弱点，以便有的放矢地进行本教程的专项练习。在课程进行的各阶段，都可以选做第六单元的试题，以便检验训练效果。

根据英国文化委员会提供的评分标准，满分为 9 分，及格线为 6 分。每套题一般为 38~40 题。答对 25 题以上就可能达到及格线 6 分。答对 24 题以下的，建议要多做听力练习，以便进一步提高听力。若只答对 12 题以下，说明英语听力基础很差，需要参加英语基础培训，建议暂时不要申请参加 IELTS 考试。

二、教师用书

“教师用书”包括录音的全部书面材料及答案。本教程配有录音带。

近年来，国外把英语短期强化教学作为专门的领域进行研究，总结出它特有的规律，形成了一整套教学理论，并根据这些理论不断更新、出版相应的教材。

希望本书的出版能够为广大学习英语的朋友提供一套实用的教材。本教程曾在北京语言文化大学出国留学预备人员培训部中英项目的学生中进行过试用，深受欢迎。在编写过程中得到在我院工作的英国、美国语言专家的热情帮助，在此谨表示衷心的感谢。

由于编者水平有限，书中缺点、错误在所难免。诚恳希望广大读者给予批评指正。
