第一部分 模拟试题

(Models)

「小力理解题」

听力测验是六级考试题的第一部分。做好这一部分对于整个考试至关重要。考生在临考 前要注意放松,不要紧张;考试中要排除杂念;而更重要的是要对试题的题型、题材等做到心中

听力测验 分为简短对话和短文两部分,每个部分由正文、问题、选择答案三项组成,如:

正文:

Woman: I need some aspirin, please, and I'd also like to get this prescription filled.

Man:

Fine, Here's your aspirin. I can have the aspirin prescription for you in

about ten minutes if you want to wait.

问题: 选择答案:

Question: Where did this conversation most probably take place? (C) At a hospital

试卷上只有选择答案及介绍、指导性文字,正文(对话或短文)及问题都在录音里。考 生只有通过这些选择答案对正文或问题进行预测,从而把握主动权。比如上例中,考生可以从 A,B,C,D 四个可能的答案中了解到,对话的正文一定谈到某个地方发生了某事,而问 题也一定是问在那里怎么样。因此,建议考生在听每道题的录音前先看一看该题的多项选择 答案,以便首先确定该题的主题是什么,可能问什么样的问题,然后有目的地听录音。

对话部分每套题有 10 个简短对话, 共 10 个问题, 每题有 4 个可能的答案, 供考生选择 其一。考生最好在听录音前先看一看选择答案,以确定问题的类型以及要问的具体内容。这 一部分大致有以下几个类型的问题:

- 1. 对话大致发生在什么地点?
- 2. 对话大致发生在什么时间?
- 3. 某事(物)要花多少时间(钱)(有的要求计算)?
- 4. 对话双方是什么关系?
- 5. 从对话中可了解到什么(隐藏的信息)?
- 6. 下面哪一项未被提到?
- 7. 对话者在谈论什么话题?

短文部分每套题有3篇短文,共10个问题,每题有4个可供选择的答案,供考生选择其 要注意常常有几个问题围绕着一篇短文,考生要确定这一短文的主题,了解文中可能有 信息,必须将这几个问题的选择答案结合起来看。短文部分的选材包括告示、广 天气预报、科普知识、说明文、文艺常识以及其他各种文选。另外,六级听力是 考生在听音过程中还要做适当记号,以便回答"下面哪一项未被提到"

最后,希望考生认识到,听力是一门技巧,需要有灵敏心听觉, 练, 通过平时不断积累, 才能取得好成绩。
