近年来,派往英国的留学生、研究生和访问学者日益增多。大部分派往英国的留学生都必须通过英国的 IELTS (International English Language Testing Service) 考试。IELTS 是对所有外国学生进入英国大学学习的一种国际性的英语水平测试,是英国大学接收外国学生的唯一的语言标准。目前加拿大、澳大利亚、新西兰等国家的大学也以IELTS 考试成绩为录取外国学生的依据。

IELTS 考试的题型不同于人们所熟悉的 TOEFL 考试形式,特别是听力部分与 TOEFL 试题完全不同,它是以大量的真实的语言环境为素材,运用了不同形式的听力练习来检查考生实际运用语言的能力。在我国很难找到类似形式的考题或听力教材。

本书的目的是通过大量、丰富、真实的语言素材,多样化的听力练习形式来培养学生的基本听力技巧,提高学生在实际的语言环境中运用语言的能力,从而使他们能适应将来在国外的学习、工作和生活,同时也使将出国的留学生了解和适应 IELTS 考试形式。

本教材共分 20 课。根据 IELTS 的听力测试的题型相应 地选择了以下主要练习形式:看图选择 (picture multiple choice)、完成笔记 (note-completion)、补全信息 (gap fill ing)、填表 (form filling)、辨别正误 (true or false) 及回 答问题 (answer questions)。本书内容广泛,选择国外生 活、学习所需要的实际语言环境,按难易程度安排。该书分两部分: 学生用书和教师用书(包括录音原文和练习答案)。

该教材适用于各类出国留学人员和工作人员,大专院校学生以及英语自学者,特别对要通过 IELTS 考试的考生将有很大帮助。

本教材曾在北京语言学院出国留学预备人员培训部中英项目的学员中进行过试用,深受学员们的欢迎。在编写过程中得到了在我院工作的英国专家的热情帮助,我们谨表示衷心的感谢。

由于编者水平有限,书中缺点、错误在所难免。我们诚 恳希望广大读者给予批评指正。


