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本书是根据国家教委 1991 年制定的硕士学位研究生入学考试《英语考试大纲》的精神、内容和要求以及 91 年、92 年两次全国统测的试题的题型、数量和难度编写的模拟试题集。

本书旨在提高考生综合运用语言的能力和应试能力。根据《英语考试大纲》的要求本人将多年来在教学中积累的资料汇总、加工、整理,编写成了这本书。本书包括:词汇与语法结构、阅读理解、完型填空、辨错与改错、英译汉和短文写作六个单项模拟试题,每项有十二个练习,另有二套综合模拟试题及 91 年、92 年和 93 年攻读硕士学位研究生入学考试英语试题,读者可以按本书编排的顺序复习,也可以从六个单项中各抽出一个练习作为一整套试题进行自测。

我希望本书会成为广大立志攻读硕士学位考生的良师益友。本书 也可供大学公共英语教学参考、使用,对参加大学英语四、六级考试的 同学、托福考生、科技人员和高等教育自学者也颇有助益。
