## 前言

国家教委颁布的《大学英语教学大纲》,将培养学生的阅读能力列为教学重点之一。阅读能力是学生今后在实际工作中,以英语为工具获取专业所需信息的必要条件,而阅读能力又与词汇的掌握密切相关,对词汇用法的熟练掌握和相对丰富的词汇量,是提高阅读能力的前提。有鉴于此,编者针对大学英语教学中阅读和词汇这两大重点,编写了这本辅助教材。

词汇部分结合《大学英语》1-4级课文中出现的语言点、词汇、词意表达和构词等内容而编写,分词汇、构词和结构三部分。每一级有10个单元,每个单元有20道练习题,1-4级共800道题,供读者实践练习,以巩固所学内容。

阅读部分所选短文涉及到科普知识、天文地理、风土人情、名人轶事等内容,文后均附有细节题、生词解意题、暗示题、结论题等。所选短文按照由浅入深的原则,根据一至四级的顺序安排难易程度。每级有40篇短文,四级共160篇,并附800道选择题,旨在提高学生的阅读能力和应试能力。

这本词汇与阅读练习教材的内容涉及面广、针对性强,可与现行《大学英语》(文理科本科)教材 1-4 册配套使用,起到辅助教学的作用,可供参加大学英语全国四级统考的学生以及具有中级以上水平的自学英语者使用。

本书编写过程中,得到了中国人民警官大学外语系吴焕成和王小平两位先生的支持与鼓励。在此,我们表示衷心的感谢。

由于编者水平所限,本书中不当之处在所难免。诚望专家、同行和读者批评指正。
