本书力求体现优化设计思想,使习题难易相当,重点突出,涉猎广泛,以目前考试中常见的替换词或选择词的形出题,使读者能够较为系统地复习和掌握一些测试中常用的动词、名词、形容词、介词、副词、连词以及短语动词和习惯用法等。书中对疑难问题做了注释。书后附有《常用短语动词表》和《常用形容词及分词短语表》,前者以英汉解形式列出,对词条在试题中出现时的题号作了标注,以便于读者参考查阅。附表中的词条是根据其在一些考试中的出现频率而选择的。
