#### 内容简介

《大学英语词汇练习》是一套英语词汇学习丛书,它根据《大学英语教学大纲》中的3,484个单词以及由这些单词构成的近于条常用调组,从目前国内外大学所采用的英语教科书、原版读物和辞书中精选了各类例句,由浅入深、循序渐进地分成六级。本书是这套丛书中的第四级。含有610个单词,140个词组,分十个单元,每单元分五个学习环节。书中突出了所要重点掌握的词汇,形式灵活多样,兼容并蓄,具有一定的科学性、实用性和趣味性。

本丛书可与目前根据《大学英语教学大纲》编写的任何一套教材 配套使用;对各类大专院校文、理科学生、研究生、进修生以及具有 一定程度的自学套都有一定的使用和参考价值。

#### 前言

《大学英语词汇练习》是根据《大学英语教学大纲》规定的词汇编写而成的一套系统的词汇学习丛书。按照《大纲》分六级教学的要求,该书分六册编写出版。在编写过程中,我们首先参考了国内外的权威性词汇论著,如"Cambridge Lexicon"(Roland Hindmarch),"A General Service List of English Words"(Michael West),《英语基本词汇》(高名凯,刘正揆)。然后对照了国内大学目前正在使用的教材,如上海外语学院编写的专业用《英语》,上海交通大学编写的理工科用《英语》,以及清华大学、复旦大

学编写的理工科和文理通用英语教科书,并且结合我们的教学体会和学生的特点,最后定量、定性地,由浅入深地将《大纲》中的3484个单词以及由这些单词构成的近千条常用词组分成六级。每级单词和常用词组具体分配数如表1所示

每册的词汇又按词性平均分为十个单元。每个单元包含 五个学习环节(如表2所示)。例句均选自目前国内外大学 所采用的英语教科书、原版读物和辞书,题材广泛,难度适 中。练习突出了所要重点掌握的词汇,形式灵活多样,兼容 并蓄,具有一定的科学性、实用性和趣味性。
