A Visit to a University

(In the reception room the Chinese host is telling a group of Dutch guests what they'll see in the University.)

Let's say once again to our Dutch friends, welcome to our University. You've just heard a little about the University. Now I'd like to tell you the programme for today. You'll visit three of the University's teaching departments as well as the library and a school factory.

To start with, we'll go and see the Physics Department. Classes will be in progress when we get there. If you're interested, you can sit in on one of the classes and get some idea of our classroom teaching methods. In the physics laboratory, you'll find students doing experiments on laser beams. After the Physics Department, there'll be the Chemistry Department.

There you'll find a lecture in progress and, as well, some of the students working in their laboratory. At present they're trying to solve a technical problem for a local factory. A few minutes' walk from there will take us to the Electronics Department. Teachers and students there will show you the computer made by themselves. Not very advanced I'm afraid, but quite good for teaching purposes. Then in a building next to this department, you'll find yourselves in our library. It isn't a very big one. Nevertheless, it does play a big role in both teaching and study as well as in research work. The five reading-rooms are always full and our stock of half a million books keeps readers busy.

From the library we'll move on to the last place you'll visit — the school factory. It was set up in 1972. There students take turns to work about a month a year. The idea is, of course, to make the students put what they've learned in the classroom into practice. They'll be glad to answer any questions you may have. After all this, if there is any time, we'll come back here and talk a bit more about our University, to round off the visit.
