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内容简介

本书是1992年9月出版的《英语中高级考试解题技巧研究与训练》的姊妹篇。作者根据教学实践证明,在考试前集中精力,对考生就测试中的重点难点进行强化训练,可收到事半功倍之效。为此,作者收集大量材料,编成此书,供考生强化训练之用。

全书包括四部分。一为"选择填空",共810题;二为"句子改错(共140题)和语篇改错(共15篇短文,150题)";三为"完形填空",共30篇短文,560题;四为"阅读理解",共110篇文章,380题。

在这几部分练习中,将难以掌握的语言点按二、四、六级分别循环出现。这样,既能使不同层次的应试者在短期内反复地温习某些语言点,加强理解和记忆,又能逐步提高解题技巧和应试能力,收到最佳效果。

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序言

我们编写的《英语中高级考试解题技巧研究与训练》自 1992 年 9 月出版以来,受到了广大读者,尤其是英语中高级考试应试者 的普遍欢迎。因该书不但简明扼要地介绍了英语中高级考试各类 试题的来历、背景和演变过程,还着重地研究各类试题的内容和测 试要求,抓住其共同之处,归纳出一般解题原则,并指出答题思路 与技巧。

不过限于篇幅,此书仅侧重一般规律的探索和测试,未能提供更多的材料进行大量的分级训练,实践证明,在考前集中精力,对考生就测试中一些重点、难点进行强化训练,可收到事半功倍之效。为了解决这个问题,编者分析大量英语中高级考卷和材料,抓住其中应试者难以对付、常常丢分的一些题型,收集大量材料,编成《英语中高级考试重点难点分级循环训练》一书,作为前者的"姊妹篇"。

本书包括四部分:第一部分为选择填空(共810题);第二部分为句子改错(共140题)和语篇改错(共15篇短文,150题);第三部分为完形填空(共30篇文章,560题);第四部分为阅读理解(共110篇文章,380题)。

在这几部分的练习中,将难以掌握的语言点按二、四、六级分别循环出现。这样,既能使不同层次的应试者在短时间内反复地温习某些语言点,加强理解和记忆,又能逐步提高应试能力,解题技巧和收到最佳的效果。


