# 前 言

本书是根据国家教委颁布的《大学英语教学大纲》和《大学英语考试大纲》的要求,参考大量国内外最新有关听力的测试材料,并结合编者多年的教学实践经验而编写的。

本书目的明确,书中不重述有关听力的理论知识,而着重于实题训练。全书涉及社会科学、自然科学、教育、欧美风土人情、史地及日常生活等各方面,所选材料都是首次在本书的听力测试题中出版,避免了听力测试材料中重复率极高的问题。本书难度较大,适用于准备大学英语六级及托福应试的非英语专业的大学生及其他英语爱好者。本书题型新颖,每套题分三部分,即 Conversation (对话)、Passage(短文)和 Compound Dictation(复合式听写),使读者兼得听与写两种能力的提高。为了节省版面篇幅,各篇听力测试题中的 Directions 除了在 Test One 中出现外,其余均已省略。本书配有录音磁带共计 3 盒,特聘外籍学者录制,并附全部录音文字及答案,以便于读者自学。

编者有多年听力教学经验,所教学生在大学英语四、六级统考中听力单项平均分数分别高达 19.18 和 18.07,但经常深感大学英语六级听力测试题的匮乏,故历经几载,编成此书,希望有助于各地的莘莘学子。编写过程中得到了山东工程学院任怀平教授和柳玉英教师的大力支持和帮助,在此表示深切的谢意。

编者水平有限,诚恳希望外语教学界的专家、学者和使用本书的广大师生提出批评,以便今后修订时改进。
