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

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内容提要

本书为《新英语教程》(第三版)主干教材《阅读》第一、二册的补充练习。练习形式均采用客观型的多项选择题。各册补充练习均包含 10 套练习,分别由阅读理解、词汇和语法结构、完形填空 3 个部分组成。每一套练习均有与教材内容配套的练习重点。书后附有全部练习的参考答案。

本书可作为课堂练习的补充,也可作为完成单元学习后的自测试题集。

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使用说明

本书是与《新英语教程——阅读》(第三版)第一、二册配套的补充练习册。由于教材中的练习多为主观型题,本练习册全部采用客观型的多项选择题,以满足教师和学生在教与学中的不同需要。本书包含两册,每册有 10 套练习,分别与教材中的各单元相对应。每套练习由三部分组成。

第一部分为阅读理解 (Reading Comprehension), 共 16 题, 用以 检查对教材中的 Part A、Part BI、Part BII 各课课文的理解。

第二部分为词汇和语法结构 (Vocabulary and Structure), 共40题, 前 30~32 题为巩固教材中相应单元内出现的重点词汇和词组, 其余的为语法结构题。语法结构练习中,第一、第二册分别有不同的重点。

语法结构练习将帮助学生进一步掌握教材中各单元的语法重点。 第三部分为完形填充 (Cloze),短文的题材与教材中的课文相 近。文中可能会有少量生词,凡影响理解的词都有中文注释。要求填 充的 10 个空中,实义词和结构词各占一定比例。此项练习有助于全 面考核学生综合运用语言的能力。

每套练习为100分,既可用作学完一个单元后的测试题,也可在学习过程中选用相应部分作为课堂练习的补充或课外作业。书后附有全部练习的答案。

大规模考试要求高效率,因而不可避免地要采用一定数量的多项选择题。为适应考试中的此类题型,同时也考虑到符合广大普通高校目前英语教学的现状,我们编写了这本补充练习。我们相信本书在提高学生的英语运用能力上定会有一定的作用和相应的价值。

本书各部分素材均选自原文书刊或词典, 语言地道, 内容丰富。 练习为作者自编。由于水平有限, 一定有不少失误之处, 敬请使用此 书的老师和同学指出, 我们将在重印时改正。
