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## 序言

根据大学英语四、六级考试委员会 1995 年通知精神:提高考试效度,重视教学本身、扎实提高学生的实际英语能力。按照通知中逐年采用新题型的要求,并结合我们在一至四级教学和研究中所积累的经验与资料,我们编写了此书,着重分析研究了清华大学学生在考试中取得较佳成绩的原因,也分析了考试中暴露出来的语言基础、应用能力以及应试方法等方面的不足之处。在编写本书时,对上述两个方面都给予了应有的注意,并提高了主观题型此例,增加了新题型和预测新题型。现分项列出:

为了使读者对最新大学英语四级考试标准、目的、内容、要求及各项试题的计分方法有一个具体的了解,本书分项后有三套模拟题,并附有一套大学英语四、六级考试委员会公布的 96"年可能采用的大学英语四级考试新题型及详细的评分标准。模拟题型之题型、题量、难易程度、考查重点和大纲及通知要求基本一致。题后有难点注释和答案,便于学生在系统复习分项做题后,熟悉新题型,进行自测,巩固已学内容。

本书主要是为参加 CET—4 考试的大学生、研究生编写的,对报考托福的人员也可应用。 书中大部分材料选自 95 年国外新出版书刊及国内外试卷。
