

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内容提要

本书是为配合中远集团船员英语适岗考试和方便船员学习英语而编写的,分两册,一册支持级、操作级适用,另一册管理级适用,内容包括:

一、笔试部分

航海 2 级(水手):选择题 200 题及注释,短语互译 200 题,英译汉、汉译英各 50 题及注释。航海 3~4 级(三副至二副):选择题各 250 题及注释,阅读理解各 30 段,英译汉各 50 题及注释,汉译英各 50 题及注释。所有试题附有参考答案。

二、听力部分

航海 2 级:听单词选择 100 题,听单句选择 100 题,听对话选择 100 题。航海 3~4 级:听单句选择各 120 题,听对话选择各 120 题,听短文选择各 24 段。所有试题附有参考答案和文字录音原文。

三、口试部分

航海 2 级:话题自述 10 个,问答题 60 个。航海 3~4 级:话题自述各 15 个,问答题各 100 个。所有试题附有参考答案和文字录音原文。

本书配有各个级别的听力和口语的录音磁带。

序

中远集团船员英语适岗考试系列教材编委会编写的 10 本船员英语适岗考试系列教材从 1999 年出版发行以来,对提高船员的英语水平发挥了重要作用,受到了广大船员的热烈欢迎。报考的船员逐年增加,考试通过率逐步加大,特别是各船公司采取了调动船员学习英语的措施及各院校、培训中心加大了培训的力度,使中远集团的船员在国际劳务市场的竞争力逐步加强,声誉不断提高。中远集团船员英语考试中心为配合船员更好地学习英语,了解英语试题的题型格式,掌握听力、口语的技巧,提高应用能力,顺利通过适岗考试,推出了不同岗级的模拟试题供船员熟悉了解。同时,为使英语试题满足岗位的要求,使其更具有针对性、实用性,船员英语考试中心聘请了航海院校的英语教师及广远、上远、青远、中波等公司的一线船长、轮机长进行拟题,使船员英语试题库的题量不断充实和完善。到目前为止,已考 45 期 21 321 人次,为中远集团船员的英语水平提高作出了很大贡献。

为了便于广大船员更好地学习英语,达到适岗要求,顺利通过适岗考试,应广大船员的要求,中远集团培训中心又将近几年来的英语试题汇编成《航海英语试题集及解答》(支持、操作级)、《航海英语试题集及解答》(管理级)和《轮机英语试题集及解答》(支持、操作级)、《轮机英语试题集及解答》(管理级),并将适岗英语词汇汇编成《航海英语词汇进阶》和《轮机英语词汇进阶》,这 6 本书作为海船船员适岗考试的指导丛书,更加完善了“中远集团船员英语测试体系”,必将对船员的考试会有很好的辅导和帮助作用。

相信这套指导丛书的出版,配合英语适岗考试系列教材的使用,对海船船员的英语水平达到适岗,促进船员的英语学习和满足国内外船东对船员的英语要求会起到积极的推动作用,对船员顺利通过适岗考试定会起到事半功倍的效果。但应注意的是,指导丛书只是备考书,用来指导船员顺利通过英语的适岗考试,不应去研究(或猜题)每期可能会考的内容。要真正掌握所在岗位的英语,还需依赖于对英语教材的刻苦学习和不间断的运用,因每期的试题不同,都会增加一些新的知识和内容。

我作为“中远集团船员英语测试体系”课题的负责人和中远集团船员英语适岗考试系列教材编委会主任,为 6 本指导丛书作序,无非是想通过几年来对中远集团投入大量的人力、财力建立起来的船员英语测试体系能够发挥更大的作用,满足国内外船东的需求,使中远集团的船员能够具有自立于世界航运界的能力。

编者的话

应广大船员的要求,现将中远集团船员英语适岗考试部分考过的试题编成《航海英语试题集及解答》,供学习参考。

《航海英语试题集及解答》分为两册,一册适用于支持级与操作级,另一册适用于管理级,内容包括:

航海2~6级笔试部分:按船员英语适岗考试笔试试题格式编排,采集航海2级选择题200题,3~6级选择题各250题;2级短语互译200题,3~6级阅读理解各30段;英译汉各50题;汉译英各50句。总题量累计近2000余道。

笔试试题除阅读理解部分只给了答案外,对选择题、英译汉和汉译英题的疑难点和常犯错误作了不同程度的注释。总计近1500余条。所给语言和专业释疑,无论对船员的适岗考试还是英语学习,都有指导性的意义。

航海2~6级听力部分:Section A 2级单词100题,3~6级单句各120题;Section B 2级单句100题,3~6级对话各120段;Section C 2级对话100题,3~6级短文各约25题。仅A,B,C三部分的题干句,累计近1500个听力句子,基本涵盖了航海业务的方方面面。

航海2~6级口试部分:Section A 话题自述2~6级各15个,Section B 问答题2级60个,3~6级各100个。口试试题2~6级采集的70多个题目和460个问题皆为各岗位的适岗业务。

听力及口试试题全部由外籍教师录制了相应的录音带。这不但适应了船员适岗考试的需要,而且反复听录音学习本试题集也是提高英语听力水平和学好航海英语的重要途径。

为便于听音时参考,听力及口试试题的答案及录音原文附后。

对如何进行应试,我们根据阅卷和教学经验,分别作了综合性“笔试指导”、“听力指导”和“口试指导”。在3个“指导”中,对适岗考试的内容、题型格式等作了详细介绍,并针对船员的应试困难,特别是听力和口试方面的实际困难,介绍了各部分的测试点及其解题技巧。船员如能认真阅读,相信肯定会有启迪和帮助。

听力与口语录音由外籍教师完成。录音磁带由王小品制作。

本习题集编辑出版工作得到各方面的支持和帮助,特此致谢。

由于时间和水平所限,难免有不妥之处,恳请批评指正。

英语适岗考试笔试试题由下列 4 部分构成：

Section A 单项选择

Section B 阅读理解

(2 级)：短语互译

Section C 英译汉

Section D 汉译英

Section A 是 30 道选择题。其内容既有语法知识又有专业知识。但语法知识的测试是紧密结合专业的，几乎全部选择题都与航海业务有关。语法知识也都是航海英语最基础的东西。例如：基本时态、语态、词语用法、非谓语动词、倒装及虚拟语气结构等。

Section B 阅读理解部分有 3 个段落(Passages)，原则上一段是科普内容，两段专业文章。

Section C 英译汉，主要是检测准确理解和表达语言的能力。3~4 级是 5 个小段，5~6 级是 4 个小段。

Section D 汉译英，主要检测书写英语的能力。3~4 级是 4 个句子，5~6 级是 5 个句子(其中第 5 题是分值为 10 分的较长句子或段落)。
