



前 言

ENJOY ENGLISH 是一套以教育部大学英语教学改革原则为指导,以《大学英语课程要求》及大学英语四级考试改革为依据,集英语听力和口语于一体的听说教材,以听力为主,听说结合。学生通过系统训练,在感受地道英语、掌握听力技能的同时,还可通过复述、模仿、扩展等手段提高自己的英语口头表达能力。

本套教材共四册,分别供四学期学习;每册八单元,建议每两周教授一单元。其特点是选材广泛,形式多样,并覆盖了改革后大学英语四级考试中听力部分的小对话、长对话、短文章、复合式听写等各种题型,有很强的实用性;各册词汇由易到难,由浅入深,循序渐进;内容涉及新闻、趣味故事、歌曲、绕口令等多种,使教材有很强的趣味性,可以让学生在轻松、愉快的氛围中学习。本教材供应用型本科院校大学英语听说课使用,也可供其他本科院校及教育学院、职业技术学院及英语自学者使用。
