

Preface

前 言

幽默故事与笑话在人们生活中的重要性是不言而喻的。人们常说: "笑一笑,十年少"; "一笑解千愁" ……显然,生活中不能没有笑声,因为笑是医病的良药,笑是生活的味精。有了笑声,我们的生活就更精彩。

有人说中国人是一个缺乏幽默感的民族。这样说不是无知,就是偏见,笔者是万万不能苟同的。中国是有5000多年历史的文明古国,中华民族从古到今有着灿烂的文化,在漫漫的历史长河中也创造出各种风格的让人捧腹的幽默与笑话。譬如早在唐朝就流传着一则幽默故事:有一天弄臣犯了错,皇帝把他推下御花园的池子,再把他拉上来问:"怎么样?你在水里有没有见到屈原啊?如果没见到,就再把你推下去。""臣见到屈原了,"弄臣居然说。皇帝笑着追问:"屈原跟你说了什么吗?""他说了,"弄臣回答,"他说他没遇上好主子,所以投了水,你有这么英明的皇帝,为什么也要投水?"一句幽默居然可以救命,实在令人惊讶。古代对联中表现的幽默更不胜枚举了。譬如有个学生上课时身上痒,东抓抓西抓抓,把老师弄火了,老师就给他出了个上联,要求学生对下联。上联是:"抓抓痒痒,痒痒抓抓,愈抓愈痒,愈痒愈抓。"学生对不出来,挨了揍,哭着回家,告诉了爸爸。爸爸说:"这有什么稀奇?我给你写好下联,明天拿去交给老师。"学生第二天把他爸爸写的下联交给了老师。下联是:"生生死死,死死生生,先生先死,先死先生。"这对子多损,但又是多么机智和幽默啊!

在现今中国人的生活中也不乏幽默与笑话。有一位教授接到一个朋友送来的古画,请他鉴定。明明是假的,教授居然也盖上鉴定印章,而且一边盖一边说:"唉,如果是行家看到,一定了解我是因为人情,不得不这么做。如果是外行看到,反正他是外行,也没什么关系。"这位教授说的虽是歪理,却不失幽默。

"I hate office work," said the son-in-law. "I can't stand being stuck behind a desk."


"Wait a minute," said the father-in-law. "I just made you half-owner of a
