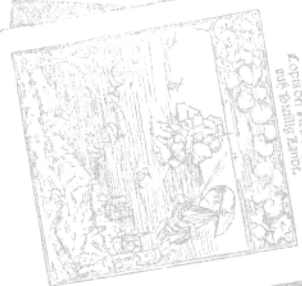

LE Roy de Perse avecq. mille chevaux & 30. mille hommes de pied assiege Dille à deux iournées de la ville de Babylon: où le grand Seigneur a fait faire commandement à tous ses laïssaïres de se rendre sous peine de la vie, & continue nonobstant ce divertissement-là à faire toujours une aspre guerre aux prencurs de Tabac, qu'il fait suffoquer à la fumée.

De Constantinople le 3. Avril 1611.

La Sainteté a finalement receu les Articles & conditions accordées concernant la paix si long temps attendue en Italie. Il est survenu dans Madrid un accident de feu qui a fort endommagé l'hôtel du Comte Olivarez, & le Palais Royal. Sa Majesté Catholique a pourveu le Marquis d'Ayton de la charge de General de la marine en la coste de Flandres, & a envoyé Dom Ferdinand Contieras pour hâter le departement de la flotte de Vestinde. Le Clergé contribue en Portugal deux cens vingt-cinq mil escus pour subvenir à la necessité presente des affaires.

De Rome le 10. Avril.

La ville d'Ulm a refusé ouvertement la contribution que le Commissaire Imperial luy demandoit, & respondu au Magistrat qu'ils acceptoyent la resolution del'assemblée de Lipic. On fait marcher contre eux les Regimens d'Italie; Mais on croit que le passage leur sera refusé par ceux de Suere & Francome, qui ont desja leué leurs Soldats.

De la bance Allemagne le 10. Avril.

Les Imperialistes se sont icy arrestez apres la prise de Francfort sur Oder, & attendent mille Hongrois que le Palatin leur doit envoyer, qui se joindront à la garnison de Landsberg, & autres troupes dont Tilly les doit grossir, capables de resister désormais aux Suedois entrez en la Silesie.

De Friedland en Silesie le 10. May.

Les Espagnols ne sont point contents, & ne trouvent point pour l'Etat de Milan que les passages de Savoye seyeent gardez par les Suisses, & dit-on que la Grande prometent d'en entretenir 30000. hommes si l'on continue la guerre. A quoy les François repliquent, sans se hâter, qu'ils ne rendront point ce qu'ils tiennent sans une bonne execution du traité de la part des autres.

De Vienne le 3. May.

On leve des gens de guerre par toute l'Autriche, Silesie, Moravie, Boheme, Baviere, & pais circonvoisins, qui donneront bien des affaires au Roy de Suede. Le Burgrave de Dona est retourné en Silesie y prendre la conduite des armées. On ne doute plus de la paix d'Italie, ny de celle de Transilvanie. On a icy publié un Edict portant que chaque maison payera deux florins dans le premier de May prochain. Le fils de l'Empereur assisté du Duc de Friddland, s'en va en qualité de Generalissime conduire les troupes qui retournent d'Italie, auxquelles se doivent joindre 24. mille hommes que ledit Duc de Friddland

GENERAL Delfino has put a new Re-enforcement of Troops into Defenzano, in that there are now in that Place 10 Companies of Regular Troops besides Militia. We have Advice from the Polestines that the Ferrabutti, or Imperial Banditi, having plunder'd a Bark that was going up the Po, the Podesta of Rovigo caus'd them to be pursued; and their Leader with some others were kill'd, 30 taken Prisoners, and the greatest part of the Booty was recover'd: But the Captain who command'd the Soldiers of the Republick was also kill'd. Some Vessels that are arriv'd from Constantinople report that the Turkish Fleet is secur'd from the Black Sea, after having furnish'd with all things necessary for their Defence, the 2 New Forts built in the Straights of Caffa over against the Muscovite Forts, for the Security of the Crimea. The 2nd Infant Regiment Signior Nicolo Delfino was chosen by the great Council to be Procurator of St. Mark, in the room of Signior Pietro Venier deceased some Days before. On this Occasion the 6 was the 3 Days together Feasting, Balls, Masquerades, and Illuminations at Signior Delfino's Palace, as is the Custom here. This new Procurator is Brother of Signior Delfino, General of our Troops on the Frontiers, and also is our Ambassador at the Court of Vienna.

From the Amsterdam and Leiden Gazettes, dated November 16. and 17.

From November 6 and 7. The 31st of last Month an Express arriv'd here from Brussels, with Letters from the Elector of Bavaria for W. A. Elector, as also Bills of Exchange for 2000 Ducats, and a Present of five Hunderd-Lee and 1 Linen. Letters from Elzan and C. arrived dated the 31st of last Month, advise that 2000 German Horse had taken one of 9 Villages of the Bergamask, all this Corn, Wine and other Provisions they could by these Horses; and that 2000 French Horse coming by Night into the Town of Oleggio and Ombino, both lying within a Mile of Genoa, plunder'd them and treated the Inhabitants with great Insolence. Letters from Mantua inform us the Jaquais de Font Government of that Place, has made the necessary Dispositions for receiving the General Orders and Troops of the 2 Crowns

that are to have their Winter Quarters there: The Duke of Mantua was expected there in order to his going from thence to Milan, and thence to the Borromean Islands for the recovery of his Health.

From the Harlem Courant, dated Nov. 22.

Colony, November 22. The 11th at Nova the Prince of Saxe Zeitz arriv'd here from Bonn in one of the Elector Palatin's Yachts, to receive, in the Name of the Emperor, Homage of this City, and made his Entry in the following manner: 1st Came a Company of Grenadiers; then 20 Companies each by 2 Horses each; next a Troop of Horse well mounted and clad, preceded by a good number of led Horses, Trumpets, and Kettledrums; after them came 8 Coaches drawn by 6 Horses each, in which were the Syndicks and ancient Burghmesters; then came a Coach in which sat his Highness the Prince, and with him the 2 Ruling Burgomasters, before and after this Coach rode the Horseguards; next came 14 Coaches in which were several Ministers, Persons of Quality, and others; and last of all came our City Troop of Horse very well mounted and accoutred. When his Highness was come to the Town-hoof our Cannon were fir'd, as they were also twice more during a magnificent Entertainment which lasted till 9 at Night. To Day at Noon his Highness receiv'd Homage of our Magistrates and of half the Burghers: To Morrow the other half of the Burghers will do Homage, and take an Oath of Allegiance, with like solemnity.

From the Rotterdam Courant, November 27. This Day put into this Port 4 Ships from Rotterdam, and 1 from Zierikzee in Ballast, bound for Bordeaux; and the Margellia of Dublin with Wine from Oporto; Thomas Lee Master, bound for Cork.

From the Rotterdam Courant, November 28 Yesterday was sent in here by the Newborough Gally, Captain Tuppoy Corcoran, a small French Vessel laden with 345; she was taken out of a Fleet of about 500 Sail under 3 Commodores, and 2000 Guernsey Privateers fell in, by the Night's Searcher of 400 Tons with 500 was taken by this Privateer, and one of 200 Tons with 100; but how many more by the rest, it being Night, the capture gave no Account.

From the Rotterdam Courant, November 28. There continue by our Roads the Majority's Ships Adventure and Nightingale, with some Ships and Vessels bound for Holland; and a Gally laden with

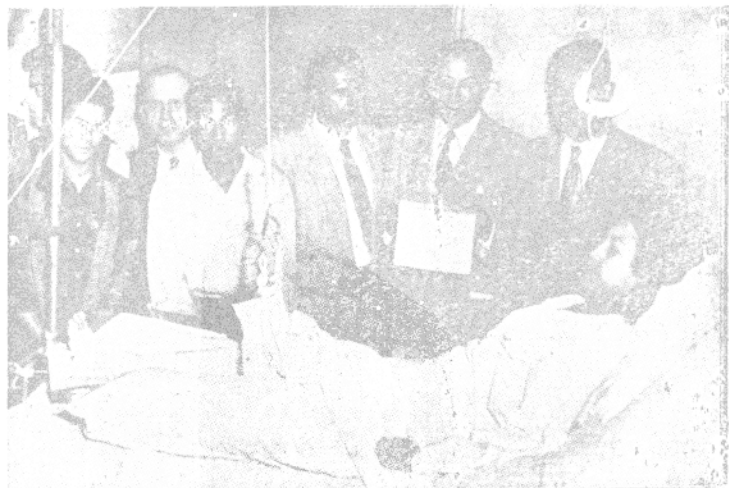

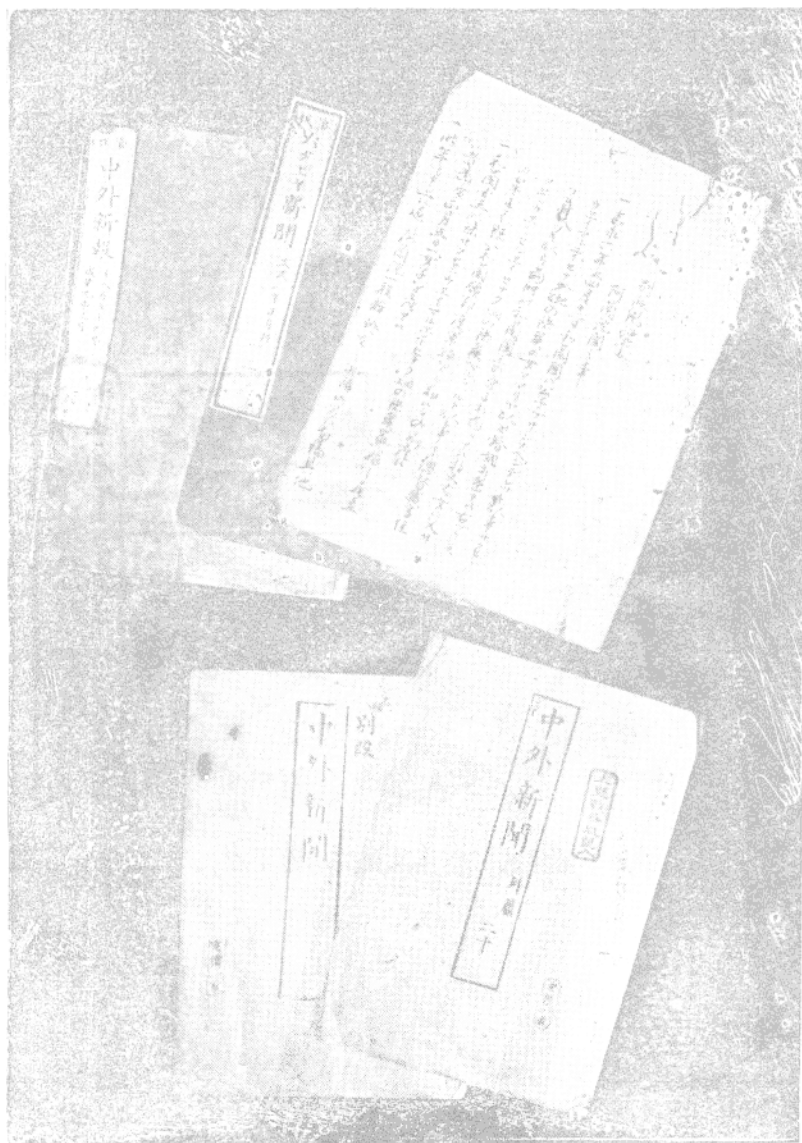

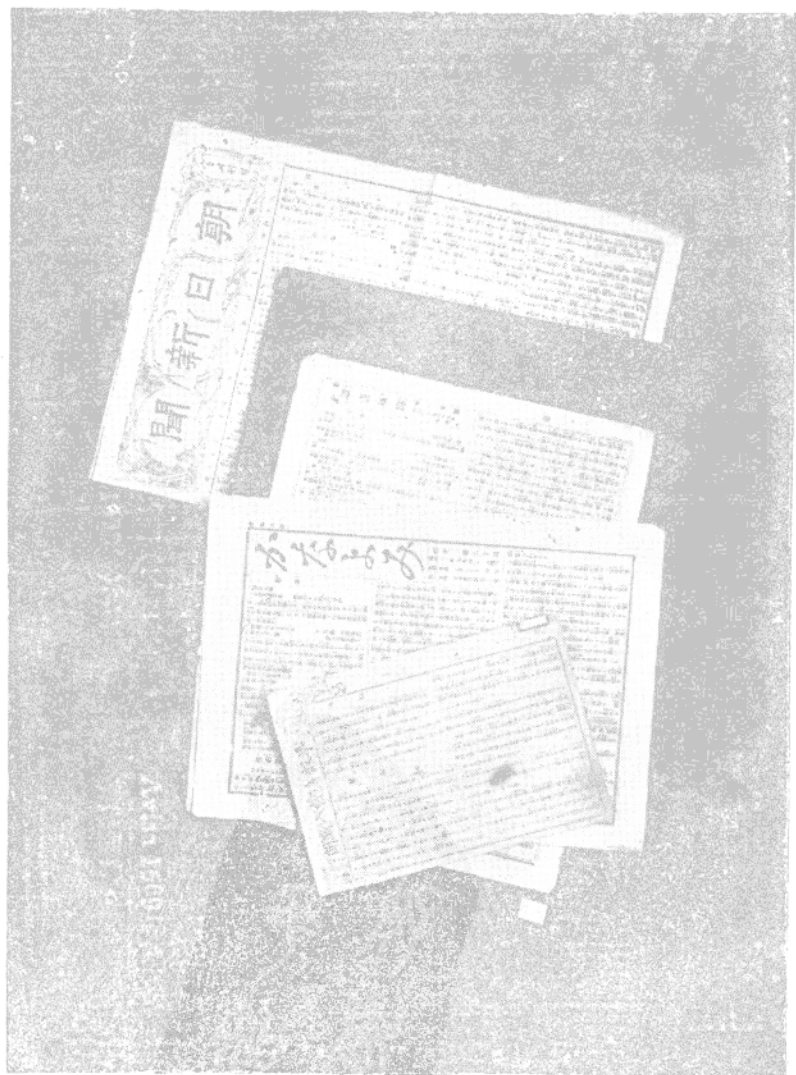
