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前言

听、说、读、写、译是外语的五项基本技能。听列于首位,这充分证明了听的重要性。语言是用来交流的,而听是交流的基础,即使在非交流语境,听也可以给自己带来乐趣。长期以来,听力的培养和提高一直是英语学习者的老大难问题。各种英语听力测试不断拓展广度和深度,也对英语听力教学提出了更高的要求。在多年听力教学过程中,我们总结出了影响学生听力的诸多因素,其中,很重要的一方面就是听力材料的选择。听力水平的提高,有赖于听力练习的"量",同时更要注重"质"。本书根据教育部最新颁布的《大学英语课程教学要求(试行)》和《高等学校英语专业教学大纲》,采用全新的教学理念,并结合作者多年的教学经验编写而成,旨在通过听力材料的精心选择和听力任务的全新设计为广大英语学习者提供大量的练习空间,帮助学习者在短期内突破英语听力瓶颈,提高英语听力水平。

全书分为初级篇、中级篇、欣赏篇3个部分,内容包括数字辨析、TOEFL的单句和对话、慢速新闻、慢速新闻与标准新闻互换、VOA和BBC标准新闻、经典英文歌曲和经典

影片对白的赏析。

与其他听力教材相比,本书具有以下特点。

第一,在材料的选择上,采取循序渐进的原则,在难度与多样性方面力求与众不同。初级篇和中级篇着重对学习者基本听力理解力的培养:短句和对话有助于学习者解决语音和语义问题;新闻内容在书中比例较大,在从慢速新闻到标准语速新闻的过渡中,安排了同一内容、两种语速新闻练习。

第二,融知识性、趣味性和实用性为一体。欣赏篇中的原 声歌曲和经典电影对白,不仅能激发学生的学习兴趣和学习 热情,达到寓教于乐的效果,还有助于提高学习者对真实英语 的理解能力,从而增强其语言交际能力。

第三,在听力任务的设置上,参考了国内外各种听力测试,涵盖选择、判断、填空、简答、听写、摘记等多种题型。

本书不同于传统的听力教材,也不是为某种听力测试而编写的应试材料。它是把学习者听力练习过程中的难点集中在一起,使听力练习更有效。

本书可作为英语专业本科生、大学英语四级后的本科生和非英语专业研究生的教材,也可供 IELTS、TOEFL 等出国考试的备考人员及英语爱好者自学。

在本书的编写过程中,我们得到了王洪刚教授的指导与帮助,他为本书提出了宝贵的修改意见,在此向他表示衷心的感谢。

由于编者水平有限,书中难免有不足之处,敬请读者批评指正。
