

#### 内容简介

本书具有时尚性、实用性、生活化、易学习的特点。全书共分为 25 章。每个章节围绕一个中心题目,提供 4 个对话场景,供学习者学习、模仿。每一章对话之后,有 20 个常用的基本句型,供学习者学习、参考。读者通过本书 100 个对话的学习、模仿,以及对 500 个基本句型的掌握,再配以每章之后简而精的练习与讨论,能大大地提高口语交际能力,掌握在什么时候、什么情况下运用英语正确表达自己的思想,进行自由交谈。另外,本书附录中的分类词汇,为读者在不同的交际场合学习、运用新词汇提供了便利。

本书适用于高等院校、高职院校学生,社会各类涉外从业人员以及英语爱好者。

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语言学习的目的是交际。但是,在语言的交际运用中,我们常常发现,许多英语学习者的口语交际能力并不尽如人意。尽管他们有一定的英语基础,有一定的阅读和写作能力,但其口语的交际能力不能满足他们学习和生活的需要。他们有强烈的提高自己口语能力的学习欲望,但不知道怎样开口说英语。有鉴于此,结合这些学习者的特点,量身定做一套适合其特点的英语口语教材就显得十分重要了。本书就是为这一目的而编写的。

在浩渺的语言海洋中,怎样给学习者指出一条合适的航道,让他们经过自己的努力,达到交际的彼岸呢?多年的教学实践告诉我们,基础阶段的语言学习者最需要的是语言的基本模式。当学习者掌握了一定的语言模式,在特定情景下给予还原,并加以应用,他们就有可能在较短的时间内学好这门语言。本着这样的理念,我们从英语学习者(尤其是非英语专业的在校大学生)的需要出发,编写了本教材。本书分为25个章节。每个章节围绕一个题目,有4个虚拟场景对话,供学习者模仿。然后提出20个实用的基本句型,要求学习者掌握。读者通过本书100个对话的学习、模仿,500个基本句型的掌握,知道在什么时候、什么情况下运用英语表达自己的意思。再配以每章之后简而精的练习与讨论,学习者就可以进行自由交谈了。为了读者的学习方便,本书附上了分类词汇。

较之其他同类书,本书有如下特点:

- 1)时尚性。本文参考了大量时尚的书刊、杂志、国内外网站,语言活泼、时尚,极具现代感。
- 2)生活化。本书的 25 个话题(topic)与年轻人的生活密切相连,除了生活中常用的一些话题外,还有大学生活、毕业生活、寻找工作场景,内容丰富,十分生活化。
- 3)易学习。本书的编者都是大学英语第一线的骨干教师,他们具有丰富的教学经验,对学生十分了解。本教材内容的编写、作业的设计、各章节的注释都考虑了学习者的需要和特点。每章的4组对话给学习者提供了学习、模仿的样板,学习者在融会贯通之后,基本能满足其交际的需要。尤其是各章节后的20个实用的句子,对学习者掌握该章节的句式有极大的帮助。考虑到学习者的英语水平各不相同,各章对话后附上了汉译文,帮助他们学习。学习者也可从汉语译文人手,逆向学习。
- 4)实用性。本书的 25 个章节相对独立,构成了较完整的整体。学习者可根据自己的需要,进行选择性的学习,并学以致用。书后所附的分类词汇方便了学习者查阅,有着极大的实用性。

帮助英语学习者学好口语,提高他们的英语交际能力,一直是我们考虑的问题和努力的方向。我们愿与广大英语学习者一道,为改善他们的英语水平、提高他们的英语交际能力而努力。
