

二语习得研究表明有意识地进行语法学习能促进学习者外语水平的提高。对于中国学生来说,外语环境的缺乏使得语法学习尤显重要。但是,如果只是一味地死啃语法书,就会出现懂得容易忘得快的现象:一打开语法书什么都会,但实际运用到语言中却错误百出。其根本原因就是语法理论知识并未内化成学习者的语言能力,学习者不能自觉地用语法知识指导语言使用。

我们认为,要使所学的语法知识内化为学习者内在的语言能力,一定量的语法练习是必不可少的。学习者在了解和掌握英语语法之后,需要通过适量的练习加以巩固和强化,以加深对语言的感知和理解。为了给中国学生提供一套系统、适量的语法练习,避免劳民伤财的"题海战术",我们精心编纂了这本《全新英语语法精练》。

本书紧扣 2000 年版《高等学校英语专业英语教学大纲》,全面体现大纲的教学要求,强调提高中国学生熟练运用英语语言的能力。在本书的编排过程中,考虑到动词时态和语态、形容词和副词、连词和从句之间不可分割的联系,将它们分别合并处理,避免了不必要的重复,也使本书的编排更加科学、合理、紧凑。

本书注重针对性,突出了中国学生英语学习中的重点和难点,略去了数词、感叹词和独立成分等相对次要的语法项目。同时,在具体语法点的选择上,充分考虑了中国学生参加各类英语考试的应试需求,总结英语专业四级、大学英语四六级考试中常考的语法项目或试题,也采用了少量的TOEFL模拟试题,以便使学习者能够了解和熟练掌握这些考试中经常出现的重点语法结构。

全书注重实用性,题型多样,既有多项选择、辨认改错、完型填空等客观 题型,也有根据不同语法项目的特点设计了部分主观题型,如连词成句和句 型转换等。在难度方面,各章语法练习也兼顾了不同难度之间的平衡搭配, 既有语法基础题,也有一定语法深度的提高题。同时,为了拓展学生的视野, 使之熟悉更多特殊的语言现象,我们还提供了部分特殊结构和特殊用法题。 本书是配合《全新英语语法》而编纂的配套练习。两者配合使用,可以形成"一课一练"的教学模式,即通过课堂讲解学习语法知识,通过相应章节的配套练习加以巩固,并即时进行补差补漏。同时,本书也具有很强的独立性,能够独立作为英语语法基础训练材料。各类英语学习者可以通过认真完成这套语法练习,来达到强化各个语言点,以点促面,系统学习英语语法,或者重温以前学过的语言知识,来达到打好语言基本功的目的。

本书可供英语专业本科生和大学公外英语学生使用,也可供有外语学习需求的社会人员和英语爱好者自学使用,同时对参加英语专业四级、大学英语四六级考试、PETS 和 TOEFL 等考试的广大考生也具有较高的使用价值。

在本书编写过程中,解放军外国语学院程工教授和王岚教授给予了大力的支持,郑庆珠教授给予了无私的帮助,陈立平教授、李志钦副教授、赵小江副教授和潘蔚娟老师对本书提出了中肯的意见。同时,本书在解放军外国语学院英语专业四年的试用中,学员们提出了宝贵的意见和建议,王赟整理和录入了全部资料,在此一并表示衷心感谢。由于编者水平有限,疏漏之处在所难免,敬请专家和广大读者批评指正。
