序

在学习英语的过程中,会遇到各种各样的问题。尤其是在达到一定水平时,必须逾越三个障碍:一是如何扩大词汇及短语量;二是组词成句的纯熟度;三是语言综合表述能力。而扩大词汇及短语量又是基础。这就要求逐渐学会认识短语、扩大短语量以及准确运用短语。为达到这一目的,可以通过多种途径,其中之一是参阅英语短语词典。

《新视角现代英语双解短语词典》的主编者徐美莲副教授 参阅了当代中外多部词典及原版书刊、收集了大量第一手语言 材料,特别是生活中、社会上常见习用的活语言材料,经过精 心选择和剖析、编著出这部词典。几十年来、我看到过许多部 英语短语词典。而这部英语短语词典在我读过和审阅过的英语 短语词典中是很有特色、非常适用的一部。这部词典称《新视 角现代英语双解短语词典》, 我认为它即新在: ①尊重英语在被 使用国家的流行实际,所选条目不受已出词典制约,"人有我 存,人无我有",所以本词典所收条目有许多属国内词典尚未 及载。 ②共收短语近 4000 条,覆盖了大中学及社会不同层次 人所用。例句新,涉及日常生活、文体、科技、社科各类。 ③ 标明各短语相当词性,这给人们遣词造句提供了很大方便,这 种做法在国内已出词书中也属首见。此外还有用中英文双解释 义和辨析精辟等特点。语言规范、准确。可供广大英语工作 者、大学生、研究生、教师、科技工作者及广大自修英语者学 习,查证或进行研究之用。一句话,这部《新视角现代英语双

解短语词典》是一部难得的、很有价值的词典。

《新视角现代英语双解短语词典》与广大读者见面,是徐副教授数年劳动的结晶,它的问世是一件值得祝贺的事! 我愿借为本书作序的机会,向渴望把英语水平进一步提高的读者们推荐这部词典。

编者的话

"It beats the Dutch how Tom always makes a basket." "I was told that George and Paul had formed a club on the Q.T..How come?" 这两句话,你可能认识或听懂句子中的每一 个单词,但你未必完全明白句子的意思。如果你不理解其中短 语的含义, 而只是机械地一一译出单词的意思, 那么, 你的译 文就会让人感到不知所云。第一句话里的短语 beat the Dutch 绝不是"打荷兰人"而是 to be strange or surprising (奇怪; 令人 诧异); make a basket 也不是"做一只篮子", 这里是 make a point in the game of basketball (投球得分)。在第二句里, 短语 on the Q.T.的意思是 secretly; without anyone's knowing (秘密 地; 无人知晓的); how come 的意思是 How does it happen that? Why? (怎么问事? 为什么?)。知道了这几个短语就不难把 上面的两个句子的意思正确地译出来,不至于闹笑话。由此可 见英语短语的实用性和重要性。短语贫乏对读懂、听懂英语和 用英语表达,都会造成障碍,无法达到交际目的。相反,短语 丰富,会提高听、说、读、写及翻译的能力。

英语短语浩翰无垠,形形色色。在学习英语短语的过程中经常会遇到以下三个问题: A.短语在句子中所起的词类作用,即,动词短语、名词短语、介词短语、形容词短语及副词短语等; B.分清短语的使用范围、频度及来源,即,正式用语、非正式用语、书面用语、军事用语、谚语、习用语与俚语等; C. 弄清短语的释义,即,字面释义、综合释义和引伸释义。

本词典就是侧重这三方面帮助学习使用英语的人,丰富英语短语知识,提高运用英语短语的能力,企望兼具同类词典之长而又能有所突破。

本词典共收英语短语约 4000 条。每一条短语都标有词性;用英汉两种语言提供一种乃至多种释义;每个释义下配有2-3个英语例句,给出相应汉语译文;在部分短语的释义下还附有英汉两种语言的注释(Notes),注释出同义或反义短语的简单辨析、短语的搭配关系及特殊用法;全书后面附有最通用英语成语表。所选例句新、范围广、覆盖面大、包括日常生活、文学艺术、体育、军事等方面的用语以及机电、航空航天、航海、冶金、煤炭、化工、医药、地质等现代科技用语。

在编写本词典过程中,参阅了大量的国内外词典、书刊和资料。张喜山副教授编" P-T 词条,张淑琴讲师编写了 U-Z 词条,并都参与了个 刊和讨论,石纯、于明华、郭广、高峤等几位中国英i ——澳大利亚专家 Timothy M·G·Clemons 对全书文"——」细心审校。又承国务院参事、北京第二外国语学院英语系周锡卿教授作序,在此一并致谢。
