内容简介

本套教材根据教育部最新颁布的《大学英语教学大纲(修订本)》编写。旨在配合课堂听力教学。帮助学生课 后进行大量语言实践操练、加强听说能力的培养、巩固事提高所学的各项技能

本套教材分上、下两朋,其36个单元。供大学一、二年级使用。每单元分为三个部分、每部分各有侧重。第一、二部分为学习内容。其中第一部分主要由对话、短文组成、侧重基础听力训练、强调语音语调的训练和语言知识点的练习;第二部分的对话和短文侧重整体理解与消化:第三部分以娱乐内容为主、旨在让学生通过听幽默故事、歌曲、诗词等进一步培养学生的语感,让学生寓学于乐。本套教材选材新颖、题材广泛、实用性强。内容包括了教学大纲所规定的听力微技能及功能意念项目。训练题在形式上与近几年大学英语四级考试试题基本一致。根据循序渐进的原则、各阶段听力训练项目的内容和语言难易程度有所不同。语速由慢到快、起点每分钟100个词、终点为每分钟120个词、各题答案直接倒排并附于各练习题之后、便于检查。各册末尾附有录音文字材料。

在世纪之交,随着我国改革开放步伐的加快、大学生学习英语的热情日益高涨。教师与学生都逐渐摆脱了传统刻板的教学模式、开始清醒地认识到要把外语作为传达信息、交流思想的工具来学习和运用。然而在实践的过程中,学习者普遍感到提高听力水平十分困难,特别是不少大学生在入学前极少受到过严格的英语听力训练,听力已经成为他们英语学习道路上的拦路虎。这套教材正是针对大学生和广大英语要好者在听力训练中存在的实际问题而编写的。编者一方面依照教育部新修订的《大学英语教学大纲》对于听力水平的要求;另一方面从学生对听力的实际需要出发,遵循外语习得的实践性原则,使本套教材具有很强的针对性和实用价值。实践证明,在外语习得过程中要具有正确的语音、语调,掌握规范的句子结构和特殊表达方式、必须从听力入手。只有通过大量的听力和其他方面的训练、才能学习和模仿一种新的语言,才有可能提高实际运用这种语言的能力。那种埋头默读、孤立背诵单词、死和语法条条的学习方法是完全违背语言学习规律的,不可能收到好的效果。本教程注重听力的基础技能训练。泛而不杂、便于自学。本套教材坚持以学生为中心、学生在教师的指导下、配上听音设备、便可在课堂上下围绕一个主题进行反复操练、达到熟练自如的程度。

本教程选材丰富生动,形式多样新颖,内容贴近现实生活,这就会极大地激发学生的学习兴趣。 学生有了浓厚的兴趣,才谈得上对所学内容的注意、理解和记忆,乃至与别人进行思想交流。

本教程虽然重视基本功的训练,但并不停留在一些常用词汇和基本句型的机械模仿上,而是强调培养学生灵活运用英语的能力。听和说是密不可分的,本教程设计的一些练习以对话的形式出现,通过对话听力训练,使学生掌握所听短文的中心大意,领会讲话者的观点和态度,甚至判断说话人的言外之意,并引导学生在真实的场景对话中提高听和说的交际能力。







