#### A FEW WORDS ABOUT THE WORKBOOK

The WORKBOOK of A New English Course, Level 1A, consists of:

- I. LANGUAGE STRUCTURE exercises that are relevant to the main teaching points of each unit. Some conventional types of exercises to revise various grammatical structures are also included. The exercises in this section are to be done after the DRILLS.
- II. GUIDED WRITING exercises that aim at dialogue making and passage writing. They are to be done after the DRILLS, the LANGUAGE IN CONTEXT and the GUIDED TALK sections have been dealt with.
- III. LISTENING COMPREHENSION exercises that form a component part of integrated language teaching. They are to be done immediately after the listening in class.
- IV. READING COMPREHENSION exercises that correspond to the READING COM-PREHENSION section in SB. They are to be done immediately after the reading in class.
- V. VOCABULARY WORK that mainly aims at word-formation. The exercises in this section may be done towards the end of a teaching unit.
- VI. SPELLING AND DICTATION. They are to be done at any time the teacher thinks fit.
- VII. BLANK FILLING exercises that aim at the integrated use of grammatical and lexical items. They may be done as the last item of the written exercises in each unit.

It is suggested that the exercises in WB should be used regularly and that the teacher should keep the work-books when they are not in use in the classroom.
