编者在多年的教学和应试辅导中体会到,若学生对一些基本句型、词汇用法及语言难点概念模糊、掌握不牢,就会在考试中耽误时间,不仅会在"语法结构和词汇"一项中大大丢分,而且还会影响听力和阅读能力的提高,更会直接影响写作水平的发挥,成为提高和运用英语听、说、读、写、译等综合能力的严重障碍。自 1987 年大学英语四级考试首次实行以来,北京邮电学院历届本科生应试通过率在北京市重点高校中均名列前茅。本书的编者都承担过每届考生的语法补习课,现将多年的教学经验、应试辅导的材料和教案整理成书,献给大家,使更多的英语学习者从中获益,提高应试能力,增强考试信心。

全书共分四个部分。第一部分为两套测试题(第二套为英语四级统考题)及其注解和答案。读者可根据测试情况检查自己的不足,进而有的放矢地进行下一步的学习。第二部分是对应试中常见的语法现象和词汇进行分门别类的归纳和总结并附相应的试题。其中语法归纳部分按其特点,将费时难记的文字变为简捷易懂、容易记忆的表格、句型和公式,并用对比的方法强调了易混淆词的用法和区别,将大量的固定搭配、习语集中罗列(比如"介词、副词"一节),减少了读者做题中查阅工具书的时间和麻烦。这部分的试题

与其归纳配合紧密,力求使读者在"讲练"中将英语基础打牢,在头脑中对语法、词法有一清晰的主线。第三部分为十套综合水平的测试题。旨在进一步测试读者对英语的语言点、句型、词汇用法等的掌握程度。第四部分为第二部分试题的注解和全部练习的答案(第一部分除外)。本书是在参考了高等学校理工科本科用的"大学英语教学大纲"(1985年版),针对大学生们平时学习和考试中容易出错的语言点、难点以及各类考试中复现率高、各类工具书没有集中归纳等基础上编写和选题的,因此在语法、词汇的归纳总结及试题的选择上并不追求全面、一一列举,而是针对难点、突出重点。

本书的第一部分及第二部分的语法归纳("介词、副词"一节除外)主要由郭曼泽副教授编写,卢志鸿整理和补充。第二部分的试题、"介词、副词"一节的语法归纳和第三、四部分均由卢志鸿编选、整理。温向明同志承担了原稿的中英文打字,全书答案的整理及试题的校对工作。首都师范大学英语系章亚杰副教授审阅了本书的部分内容。

本书的编写和出版得以顺利进行,得力于北京邮电学院外语 系领导和老师们的大力支持和热情帮助及出版社同志们的通力协 作,在此深表谢意。

由于编者水平有限、时间仓促,错误之处在所难免,谨请广大读者、英语教师及同学们谅解并提出宝贵意见。
