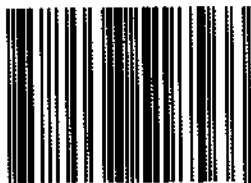

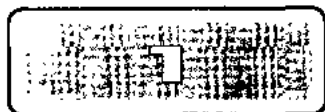

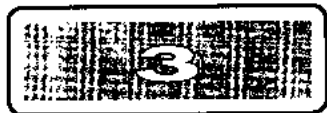

When someone says, "Well, I guess I'll have to go to face the music," it doesn't mean he is planning to go to a concert. It is 1 far less pleasant, like 2 in by your boss to explain why you did this and did that, and 3 you did not do this 4 that. Terrible music, indeed, but it has to 5. At some time or another, every one of us has had to "face the music", especially 6 children. We can all remember father's angry voice: "I 7 to talk to you!" And only 8 we did not obey him. What an unpleasant business it 9!

The phrase "to face the music" is known 10 every American, young and old. It is at least 100 years old. Where did the 11 come from?

The first 12 comes from the American novelist James Fenimore Cooper. He said, in 1851, 13 the expression was first 14 by actors while 15 in the wings (舞台的两侧) to go on stage (舞台). After they got their clue (得到暗示) to go on, they often said, "it's time to go to face the music." And that is 16 what they did face the orchestra (管弦乐队) which was just below the stage.

An actor might be frightened or 17 as he moved onto the stage 18 the audience that might be friendly, 19 perhaps unfriendly, especially 20 he forgot his lines. But he had to go 21. If he did not, there would be 22 play. So, "to face the music" came to 23: having to go through something, no matter how 24 the experience might be, because you knew you had no 25.

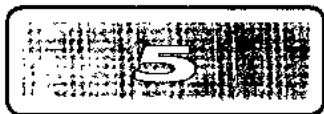
